# Microbrewery plan approved for community pub - despite objections

PLANS have been approved for a microbrewery at the historic Raven Inn at Glazebury – despite objections from three members of the public.

Warrington Borough Council planning chiefs have approved the application submitted by the Raven Partnership.

The scheme involves extending the ground floor of the building and erecting a two-storey extension at the rear of the building. The tap room will be on the upper floor.

The Raven Partnership say although they would like the community pub to be continued throughout the whole building, this is, unfortunately, unfeasible. The microbrewery and tap room will help support the economic future of

the pub.'
Objectors fear the development could result in noise, smells, a loss of parking space and spoil the appearance of the historic pub.

But planning officers say the proposals are acceptable and respect the scale and form of the existing building. Openally the existing building. Overall, the extension will not detract from the

significance of the building. Any harm caused to the building will be offset by the public benefits of introducing a complimentary use which will be linked to the existing

community-run pub.

The Raven has a long history, dating back to the mediaeval Earliest evidence the building's history has been narrowed down to the 15th century when it was a water mill, before being repurposed as an inn around 156Ž

The pub was purchased by the local community in April 2022 after a controversial plan to demolish the building and redevelop the site for housing caused a local uproar.

# Electric Vehicle chargers refused

PLANS for four electric vehicle charging bays at the Greyhound Service Station, in Warrington Road, Glazebury, have been thrown out by Warrington Planning chiefs after tour objections were received.

Planning officers said the proposals failed to show that the layout of the service station and the proposed charging boys would provide a safe area for charging electric vehicles or provide adequate visibility.

In addition the area is in a

flood zone and, historically, there had been flooding caused by the nearby Pennington Brook.

Although flood defences had been built, they did not completely rule out the possibility of turther flooding.

flooding.

The Greyhound Hotel on the opposite of the East Lancs Road had also experienced flooding

Objections from members of the public concerned fears of noise and disturbance caused by round-the-clock use of the chargers.



## Independent calls for urgent review of parish council finances

WARRINGTON Borough Council says it is not the regulatory body to investigate alleged financial issues at Culcheth & Glazebury Parish Council.

It follows a call by independent Cllr Neil Johnson calling on the borough council to investigate alleged financial irregularities at

alleged financial irregularities at the parish council.

Cllr. Johnson issued a statement, which he published on social media saying he had once again turned "whistleblower" and was calling for an urgent, external investigation into the finances and accounts of Culcheth and Glazebury Parish Council over what he describes as "irregularities" that need to be "irregularities" that need to be explained.

He said he and fellow Parish Councillors were called to a "Parts 2" meeting prior to Christmas, where it was explained that the Parish Council's paperwork and accounts were in a poor state.

Councillors were asked to keep

what they were told confidential.

The Parish Council had just appointed a new Clerk, after the previous staff member left in 2024. For some time, the post was held by

a temporary volunteer. Cllr. Johnson explained:"Once again, I find myself in the position of whistleblower, but I will not stay quiet over what I have learned. This is public money, which people pay through their taxes, and they have a right to know.
"Parish Councillors

informed just prior to Christmas of the dreadful state of the Council's

accounts and paperwork."

He went on to say: "The new

Clerk is doing his very best to try and get to the bottom of matters. This is not his fault. But we need to go further.

go rurrner.

"There should be an urgent, external investigation commissioned into the Parish Council's finances, accounts and paperwork. This should be overseen by Warrington Borough Council, but should be independent of them." independent of them.

A Warrington Borough Council spokesperson said: "We are not the regulatory body for parish councils and have very limited powers in relation to the activities of parish

councils.

"We can investigate alleged breaches of a parish council's Code of Conduct by individual members and make recommendations about that to the parish council, but these recommendations do not have to be accepted by the parish council.

"There is also a requirement under the Local Audit and Accountability Act 2014 for Parish Councils to keep accounts and to appoint an independent and competent guiditor, and competent competent auditor and co-operate

with that audit.

"If a parish council does not comply with the law, then members of the public may take legal action through the courts or engage with the Local Auditor. If you have cause to believe that activity has taken place at the Parish Council which might constitute a criminal offence, you may wish to report the matter to Cheshire Police.





# Significant investment required to tackle flooding issues says MP

WARRINGTON North MP Charlotte Nichols says it is clear "significant investment" is required to tackle flooding issues in the town and is lobbying for extra support.

During the recent floods, which included on the main Warrington Road at Glazebury, she met with the Minister for Flooding Emma Hardy, DEFRA, MHCLG, the Met Office and the Environment Agency to discuss the flooding experienced in Warrington over New Year.



Following the meeting, Ms Nichols said: "MHCLG have primary responsibility for flood emergency recovery, and response costs, both of which are discretionary and I am lobbying Alex Norris as the Minister with Alex Norris as the Minister with responsibility in this area for additional support for Warrington. Potential support in terms of match funding was also mentioned, which we will be exploring, particularly for those who struggle to get adequate insurance coverage as a result of previous flooding or who

may struggle going forward.

"Affected constituents I have spoken to have rightly made the point that this is the second major event in a short space of time, and raised concerns about resilience for flooding and what maintenance work has been undertaken.

"The Government review of the flood formula is coming up, and I will be feeding in to ensure that maintenance work is part of the calculation, and not just remedial work which will hopefully help mitigate future risk."

Commenting on flooding in other parts of the town Ms Nichols added:"The Environment Agency made the point that dredging is

only a very short-term help, and walls, nature-based infrastructure, property level protection and property level protection and temporary barriers are more effective in preventing flooding. "It is clear we need significant

investment in our regional infrastructure as all the flood basins across the region filled and overtopped, with the River Mersey 50cm higher than its previous record. With extreme weather becoming more frequent as a result of climate change, better preparedness is vital to prevent future incidents.

"They are also investigating a reported failure of the local pumping station, which may have contributed to some of the flooding experienced locally. I am waiting hear from the Area Director of the Environment Agency with further information on this, as well

as seeking to arrange a meeting with residents and the agency to talk about future resilience and what can be learned from what's happened.

## Plan to create living accommodation above stables

PLANS have been submitted to Warrington Borough Council for a complete refurbishment of a stables

complete returbishment of a stables building – including the creation of an upper floor with living accommodation for a groom.

The building is in Cross Lane, Croft, opposite Eaves Farm.

It is a steel framed building, of double height with elevations consisting of part blockwork and part Yorkshire boarding and a metal clad roof.

It is currently used for stabling

It is currently used for stabling and agricultural storage associated with Eaves Farm.

The plan is to refurbish the external appearance of the building and provide a first floor level with residential accommodation for a groom to keep and rear the horses kept on the site and at Eaves Farm. The groom currently has 10 horses which she breeds and rears for competition. They do not require grazing in the traditional manner, grazing in fields for only two hours a day as they need to be kept in stables most of the time for their safety. The ground floor of the building would remain as at present, but with a staircase to the new first floor, which would extend to the full width and height of the

building.

The building would retain its existing scale and agricultural

Borough council planning officers are currently studying the

proposals.



# Under fire MP says she is working to help those missing out on Winter Fuel Allowance

INDEPENDENT Councillor Neil Johnson says that Labour MP Charlotte Nichols should "hang her head in shame" over her Party's decision to scrap Winter Fuel Allowance payments for millions of pensioners.

But the Warrington North MP has hit back saying she has been working to help ensure those most in need and missing out on Winter Fuel Allowance, are now getting Pension

Credit.

It follows criticism from Cllr Johnson who said the "cruel and heartless" decision had affected dozens of pensioners throughout his ward of Culcheth, Glazebury and Croft, and the effects have been felt particularly

acutely during the recent cold snap.
Cllr Johnson said:"The Labour
Party picked the pockets of
pensioners when they voted to scrap the Winter Fuel Allowance last year. This cruel and heartless decision is being felt by people all over the villages I represent. The recent spell of snow and ice has seen some of the coldest temperatures experienced in our country for over 15 years. This was not the time to take between £200 and £300 away from our senior citizens.

"I have been out throughout the cold spell, helping to support the most vulnerable, whether collecting their shopping or helping them to claim additional money for their heating bills through things like pension credit yet there are still some people." credit. Yet there are still some people worried about turning their heating on because of the cost

"Labour said that only those with the broadest shoulders would bear the broadest shoulders would bear the burden of economic recovery. So why have some pensioners whose income is only £13,000 been hit? Those are not the broadest shoulders! "Disgracefully, our MP Charlotte Nichols told people on Facebook that she would vote to keep the Winter Fuel Allowance in place. Then she

Fuel Allowance in place. Then she did the exact opposite and voted to scrap it. How can we ever trust a word she says again? Her behaviour has been beyond contempt and she should hang her head in shame. "While some of us have been out

helping the elderly get through this cold snap, Ms Nichols hasn't been seen. I suspect she will have had her feet up with the heating on. It's alright

for some!

"I now challenge her to join me in writing to the Chancellor, Rachel Reeves, to call for the Winter Fuel Allowance to be reinstated for Allowance to be reinstated for all pensioners. I say it was the wrong decision and it should be reversed. Will she join me in this call? It would be a very powerful statement if representatives of different political colours — one labour case labour and the Labour, one Independent – made the same argument. What do you say, Charlotte?

In response, Ms Nichols said:



"The new Labour Government came to power with a dire economic inheritance and public power with services crumbling after years of mismanagement by the Conservatives. Difficult decisions Conservatives. Difficult decisions have had to be made in an effort to turn this around by the Chancellor Rachel Reeves, including addressing a £22bn in-year black hole in the nation's finances.

"Labour committed to the Triple Labour committee to the Inple Lock for pensioners in our manifesto, and this has rightly been prioritised in order to protect the incomes of all pensioners, leaving even those no longer eligible for the Winter Fuel Allowance better off overall. The changes to the Mineworkers' Pension Scheme have also further boosted the incomes of many pensioners living locally, by an average of 32%.

"I have made the case to the Government since the decision that

the Pension Credit eligibility threshold should be lifted, and my office and I have been supporting affected



residents in ensuring they are claiming what they are entitled to. We have what they are entitled to. We have had a number of constituents who had not previously claimed Pension Credit, wrongly believing they were not eligible, now in receipt of this support including back payments and I would encourage anyone struggling to reach out to me or to the Citizens Advice Bureau for a Benefits Check. "For those confirmed as above the current Pension Credit threshold.

the current Pension Credit threshold, energy providers, including Octopus Energy, have scnellles ..... provide support including payment standina charge holidays breaks, standing charge holidays and clearing energy bill debt, that we have referred people to, and the Household Support Fund is also available through the Council to anyone concerned about meeting the cost of their energy bills.
"While the Winter Fuel Allowance

decision was not one which anyone wanted to take, I am doing all I can to ensure support is there for anyone who needs it"
