## Lymm Clothing Charity – an ancient charity with a modern outlook

STARTING in the 1690s, Lymm Clothing Charity originally gave out clothes and money to the poor in Lymm.

Over the years it benefited from various legacies, but has always tried to move with the times. Since the 1900s it has always just given money to those who need it in

Kath Buckley Chair of the charity said: "It is an honour and great pleasure to be chair of such a worthwhile, focused charity. Since becoming chair two years ago I and the committee have tried to reach out to those in Lymm who need our charity. To this end I have given talks to many organisations in Lymm such as The Rotary, Lymm Youth and Community Centre; I have visited and spoken to Outrington Luncheon Club, The Sanctuary Café, distributing to them our application form etc. I have also been on Mix 56 twice – they also have our application form. I have also communicated with all the schools in Lymm both primary and secondary, explaining who we are and of course giving them our application form. As I am also Chair of The Citizen's Advice Bureau for Warrington, they also have our information.

"I have with the committee's permission, changed how we operate and we now tend to give out fewer but more substantial sums of money to those who apply to us. Currently in the last two years we

have given out nearly four thousand pounds to people in Lymm. This has been for: broken appliances and other house hold items, food, and other things as the need has arisen. Most of our applications have come from schools identifying families who need our help.

"The charity meets four times a year and we have a set amount that we can give out each year –

roughly one and a half thousand pounds. We have given out slightly more recently as the charity did not give out a lot during Covid

"Application to benefit from our charity is simple, an easy one-sided form has to be filled in and the criteria are that the person/family has to live in Lymm and of course that they are a genuine case.

## Community meeting to address bus concerns at Lymm

AN estimated 130 residents gathered at Lymm Village Hall to voice their concerns about the bus services between Lymm and Altrincham.

The meeting, attended by officers from Warrington Borough Council and Transport for Greater Manchester, provided a valuable opportunity to collect feedback aimed at enhancing the new Bee Network and its cross-boundary operations.

The recent transition from the X5 service, which previously ran from Warrington to Altrincham, to the Warrington to Altrincham, to me current service has prompted calls for extended operating hours and increased frequency. Currently, the service runs every two hours, and residents are advocating for more regular intervals.

Jular inie, Additionally, attendees highlighted need improvements to the service between Dunham, Warburton, and the Lymm. The 280 service has faced challenges in recent years due to the reclassification of a canal bridge, which has disrupted rural connectivity.

The meeting was chaired by Councillor Graham Gowland, with

contributions and support from local Borough and Parish Councillors representing the affected parishes. Councillor lan Marks led a discussion towards the end of the meeting, focusing on the changes to the service in Statham.

Officers from both councils were receptive to the issues raised and committed to exploring potential service improvements to better meet

the community's needs.
Officers will review the feedback collected during the meeting and document specific issues suggestions. Progress communicated through newsletters, local media Community meeting, and social media to keep community informed about upcoming changes.

### How Residents Can Stay Involved

Residents can stay involved by attending meetings, follow-up joining community groups, staying informed through council updates, and encouraging others to participate. By staying active and engaged, residents can play a crucial role in shaping the future of local transportation services. Most importantly, residents are encouraged to use the local buses to support the service.

A spokesperson for Warrington's

Own Buses said: "The X5 was a popular service providing direct buses from Warrington and Lymm to Altrincham and Manchester Airport.

"Warrington's Own Buses are keen to work with TfGM to explore any new opportunities to reinstate the contract for this service."



### Up to eight weeks of road closures on A56 Higher Lane

UP to eight weeks of evening road closures are scheduled for the A56 Higher Lane at Lymm for

carriageway resurfacing works.

The closures will take place between 7 pm-1 am in a bid to

between / pm-1 am in a pia io minimise disruption.

Warrington Borough Council has given notice it intends to make an Order under Section 14 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984. The effect of which will be to introduce a prohibition of driving & clearway as follows: A56 Higher Lane from its junction with High Legh Road & Burford Lane to the Borough Boundary; High Legh Road from its junction with Higher Lane to Kay Lane. The Order will be effective from

24th March 2025. The restrictions are for a period of 8 weeks, between 7pm to 1am, however,

will be in place as and when signed on site. Access will be under the control of the relevant Contractor for the duration of the works. The alternative routes will be as follows: A56 Higher Lane via B5159 High Legh Road, B5159 West Lane, A50 Warrington Road, A556 (north), A56 Lymm Road, A56 Agden Brow or via A56 Agden Brow, A56 Lymm Road, A556 (south) A5034 Chester Road, A50 Warrington Road, B5159 West Lane, B5159 High Legh Road; High Legh Road via B5159 West Lane, A50 Warrington Road, A50 Cliff Lane, A50 Knutsford Road, A56 Stockport Road, A56 Camsley A56 Booth's Hill Road, A56 Higher Lane and vice versa. The restrictions are required for carriageway resurfacing.

## Parish council open applications for grant funding

LYMM Parish Council has opened applications for grant funding for

local community projects.

Local community groups or organisations planning to run events in Lymm for Lymm residents could be eligible for grant funding from Lymm Parish Council.

Round 1 for 2025-26 is now open, with a funding pot of £8,000 to share amongst deserving causes.

The application deadline is March 28th, 2025, and project delivery must take place or start between April and September

Previous successful applicants include Lymm Festival who used their funding for hiring the

village hall, Lymm in Bloom who purchased tools, equipment and plants for the village, Lymm Repair Café for hall hire and setup costs, and May Queen Festival who used their funding for running costs for the community event.

## Councillor vacancy for Lymm North ward

LYMM Parish Council currently has a Parish Councillor vacancy which will be filled at the Full Council meeting in April, and will be voted for by the current 11 Councillors.

The meeting will take place on April 8th, at 7.30pm in the village hall (Pepper Street) and the vacancy follows the resignation of Emma Langman.

Councillors have three main components to their work.

 Decision making – Through attendings meetings and committees with other elected members, councillors decide which activities to support, where money should be spent, what services should be delivered and what policies should be implemented.

2. Monitoring - Councillors make sure that their decisions lead to efficient and effective services by keeping an eye on how well thing's

are working.

3. Getting involved locally – As local representatives, councillors responsibilities towards constituents and organisations. These responsibilities and duties often depend on what the councillor wants to achieve and

how much time is available.

The National Association of Local Councils (NALC) has lots of free, useful information including "The Good Councillor's Guide" which are a worthwhile read to help you make your decision. See www.nalc.gov.uk

their duties occupy them for a few hours a week. There are some councillors who spend more time than this – and some less. You would need to attend the monthly Full Council meetings as well as joining at least one committee and


"In fact, I was on the mayor's table at the event and current Mayor Wendy Johnson echoed the same sentiment.







### Your pet questions answered

Is it safe for my pet to eat spring plants or flowers that start growing during spring?

during spring?

It is lovely seeing all the spring bulbs coming through, but some bulbs are toxic if ingested by our dogs. Daffodils, bluebells and tulips fall into this category, as well as indoor plants such as lilies and amaryllis. Lilies, for example, are of high risk to cats, and even small ingestions can lead to severe kidney damage. Always check the toxicity damage. Always check the toxicity of plants and flowers in your garden

Are there any specific parasites I should be concerned about as the weather gets warmer in April?

As temperatures rise in April, the risk of parasites like fleas and ticks

risk of parasites like fleas and ticks increases. It is important to ensure that you check your pet regularly, and if you frequently walk your dog around woodland or parks a regular preventive treatment is a sensible idea. Consult with our team to choose the appropriate products and to discuss any concerns about parasites local to our area.

My pet has seasonal allergies that seem to flare up in April. How can

I help them?
Pets can suffer from seasonal allergies, often aggravated by increased pollen levels. Symptoms can include itchy or red skin, fur loss, can include lichy or rea skin, für loss, anal gland irritation, itchy ears and watery eyes. Often allergies can settle down on their own and using a hypoallergenic shampoo may help, but many pets need medication to alleviate their discomfort. There are lots of different ways to help manage irritation. Please call our team to discuss the best options for your pet.

As spring gardening begins to get under way, are there any fertilisers or garden products I should avoid using around my pets?

Many common gardening



products, including fertilisers, insecticides and weed killers, can be harmful to pets if ingested. When choosing products for your garden, opt for pet-friendly alternatives. Always store garden chemicals out of your pet's reach and prevent access to treated areas for the recommended period on the product labels. If you suspect your pet has ingested a harmful substance, contact us immediately.

### How bad is it if my pet eats chocolate and how can I keep them safe at

Chocolate is not safe for pets to eat. It contains theobromine and caffeine, both of which can be toxic to dogs and cats. The level of toxicity depends on the type and amount of chocolate consumed and the weight of your pet. Darker and more concentrated chocolates are more dangerous. Symptoms of chocolate poisoning may include vomiting, diarrhoea, rapid breathing, increased heart rate and even seizures.

To keep your pet safe during Easter:

- Store chocolate securely and keep all chocolate products well out of reach. This includes Easter eggs and chocolate decorations.
- Educate family members and ensure that everyone in the household understands the dangers of feeding chocolate to nets
- Provide pet-safe treats so they can participate in the festivities without the risk.
- If you suspect your pet has eaten chocolate, confact us immediately. Prompt action can be crucial.

### Divorce Column

### Quick fire questions

### 1. How long does a divorce take?

It will take at least 26 weeks from start to finish. There will be a 20 week holding period (sometimes referred to as a cooling of period) between the date of the divorce application and the making of a conditional order and there must be a period of at least 6 weeks from conditional order to applying for a final

### 2. Do I need consent to divorce?

No, consent is not required. We live in an era of no-fault divorce so all that's required is for you to state in your application that the marriage has irretrievably broken down and whether or not your spouse agrees with this or consents to a divorce is

### 3. Does it matter who starts the divorce?

No, in the sense that it will make no difference to the outcome of sorting out the finances ancillary to divorce or to resolving any dispute concerning child arrangements. But in sole applicant cases (as opposed to joint) the sole applicant will be in the driving seat and so have more control over the timing of some aspects of the divorce process and there may be a benefit in being in this position.

### 4. How much does a divorce cost?

It can and does vary. Many solicitors will deal with the divorce on a fixed fee basis. The fixed fee can of course vary from one firm to another but typically you should expect to have to pay a few hundred pounds plus the court fee. There will be vat on the solicitors charges but there is no vat on the court fee. The costs of sorting out finances and child arrangements are separate from the costs of the divorce.

### 5. How long do I have to be married before I can divorce?

You must be married for at least 12 months before you can apply for a divorce. You can of course enter into negotiations over finances and child arrangements from the moment you separate even if you cannot straightaway apply for a divorce.
