

Championing the talents of a new generation of artists

TWO exhibitions aimed at championing the talents and voice of a new generation of artists have opened at Warrington Museum and Art Gallery.

More than 60 talented art and design students from both Warrington and Vale Royal College (WVRC) and Priestley College are currently showcasing their work in a professional gallery setting in their hometown as part of their development.

WVRC directly collaborated with the Museum team on 'From The Collections' – producing new artworks in response to items they found within the historic building's vast collection of exhibits and archives.

The students learnt about the importance of research as the foundation of their arts practice and were inspired by a diverse range of artefacts, including an 1842 report on child labour in pin factories, a reticulated python skeleton and even a poster advertising 'Mr Usher's Cat Circus'.

Kelly Broughton, subject lead in Art for WVRC, said: "It's been a real confidence booster for students to see their work exhibited in a gallery, gaining valuable practical experience of working as an artist in the industry which is something we are passionate about at college.

"Huge thanks to the Museum's gallery and archives teams for their incredible support throughout." Meanwhile, Priestley College's show saw second-year art and design students respond to the themes of resistance, change and activism to celebrate the voice, concerns and aspirations of a new generation for an exhibition called Protest.

The thought-provoking and challenging collection of work, created over 10 weeks, also features some figurative work created by first-year students.

Gary Jones, Art and Design course co-ordinator at Priestley College, said: "We are incredibly grateful to Warrington Museum for providing this wonderful opportunity for our students. This exhibition represents a significant milestone, giving them the invaluable experience of showcasing their work in a professional gallery setting.

"It's rewarding to witness their creative journeys culminating in a collection that showcases such a broad range of ideas and processes. For our first-year students, this project has been about challenging perceptions and exploring the complexities of stereotypes.

"Our second-year students, given free rein on the theme of protest, have created a diverse body of work reflecting their individual interests and concerns.

"Having more than 50 students contribute to this show, the product of 10 weeks of dedicated work, is a testament to their talent and hard work, and a true boost to their confidence as emerging artists."



Cycle Hub celebrates stellar first six months

Warrington Cycle Hub – a one-stop shop for all things cycling in the heart of the town – is celebrating a hugely successful first six months.

Located on Crown Street in Warrington town centre, the hub officially opened its doors in Summer 2024. It has quickly become a vital resource for cycling enthusiasts of all levels, from seasoned riders to those just starting out. The hub has already made a

significant impact on the cycling community, with the skilled and dedicated team delivering a comprehensive range of services and activities. Since opening, they have:

- Welcomed almost 1,500 visitors.
- bike Delivered maintenance sessions to nearly 100 people, empowering cyclists to keep their bikes in top condition.

Significant step toward carbon-neutral production

Novelis Inc., a sustainable aluminium solutions provider has successfully tested using hydrogen fuel to power a recycling furnace at its UK plant in Latchford, Warrington.

The tests were carried out as part of a UK government decarbonisation programme and in collaboration with Progressive Energy, an independent UK energy company, and required the installation of new burners, regenerators, and furnace lining material. Using hydrogen instead of the same amount of natural gas when operating a melting furnace can reduce CO2e emissions by up to 90%

to 90%. "Exploring renewable energy sources, such as hydrogen, making first mover investments, and reducing energy intensity are part of our 3×30 vision to advance aluminium as the material of choice with circular solutions", says Emilio Braghi, Executive Vice President, Novelis Inc., and President, Novelis Europe. "With the significant expansion of our local recycling capacity, we are transforming the Latchford site into a prototype for high-recycled content and decarbonised aluminium production."

With safety as the top priority of

the hydrogen pilot project, several series of tests were conducted by blending different percentages of hydrogen with natural gas (30%-100%) to evaluate the impact on existing infrastructure, and

equipment compatibility.

During the trial campaign, several hundred tonnes of 3000 series scrap aluminium alloy were remelted and cast into sheet ingots.



Sports bar rebrands after threat of legal action

A Warrington town centre sports bar originally named in honour of local darts supremo Luke Littler has rebranded after being hit with a trademark warning.

Trademark warning. Originally set to be named Nukes Sports Bar at The Hive in Sankey Street, named after the nickname for Littler – Luke the Nuke, the venue aimed to pay homage to Littler and other darts players.

But after the threat of legal action from Littler's solicitors, the brand new sports bar, has renamed as McCoys replaced Religion Coffee which is moving to a space inside The Hive, a boutique shopping centre. Both businesses are owned by Owen Williams, who also runs the The Tank Bar and Live Lounge.

Mccoys has big screen tvs which can be seen at every angle. Owen said: "We are also

bringing affordable drinking to the town allowing people of all ages to socialise, play pool, darts and enjoy live sport without costing the earth. "I also own tank bar, a live Music

venue bringing the best atmosphere in late night venues."

Divorce Column

Quick fire questions

1. How long does a divorce take?

It will take at least 26 weeks from start to finish. There will be a 20 week holding period (sometimes referred to as a cooling of period) between the date of the divorce application and the making of a conditional order and there must be a period of at least 6 weeks from conditional order to applying for a final order.

2. Do I need consent to divorce?

No, consent is not required. We live in an era of no-fault divorce so all that's required is for you to state in your application that the marriage has irretrievably broken down and whether or not your spouse agrees with this or consents to a divorce is irrelévant.

3. Does it matter who starts the divorce?

No, in the sense that it will make no difference to the outcome of sorting out the finances ancillary to divorce or to resolving any dispute concerning child arrangements. But in sole applicant cases (as opposed to joint) the sole applicant will be in the driving seat and so have more control over the timing of some aspects of the divorce process and there may be a benefit in being in this position.

4. How much does a divorce cost?

It can and does vary. Many solicitors will deal with the divorce on a fixed fee basis. The fixed fee can of course vary from one firm to another but typically you should expect to have to pay a few hundred pounds plus the court fee. There will be vat on the solicitors' charges but there is no vat on the court fee. The costs of sorting out finances and child arrangements are separate from the costs of the divorce.

5. How long do I have to be married before I can divorce?

You must be married for at least 12 months before you can apply for a divorce. You can of course enter into negotiations over finances and child arrangements from the moment you separate even if you cannot straightaway apply for a divorce.

Warrington and Halton Teaching Hospitals urge pregnant women to get lifesaving RSV vaccine



Expectant parents can now receive a new vaccine to protect their baby against respiratory syncytial virus (RSV).

The lifesaving vaccination offers newborn babies protection against RSV, a common virus that affects the airways and lungs. It can be spread all year round and causes coughs and colds, but in some cases can cause more serious illnesses such as pneumonia or bronchiolitis.

For babies, it can cause inflammation and blockage of the small air tubes in the lung, making breathing and feeding difficult, which may mean they need to be treated in hospital.

The NHS vaccination programme was rolled out in September 2024, and since then hundreds of babies

and since then hundreds of babies across Warrington and Halton have been protected against RSV. Raveen Tank is a mum of two who lives in Warrington and is expecting her third baby. Both of Raveen's children had bronchiolitis which resulted in them needing hospital care. Talking about her children's experiences, Raveen said: "Our eldest Daya was just 28 days old when he caught the virus. It started from a sniffle that my husband had, which for adults is easy to recover from but for a small baby can cause serious health complications. Sunil, our second baby, was also very young at just two months old when he became poorly. Seeing my children with all the equipment needed for treatment was really scary, but it's actually avoidable with the new vaccine."

Raveen recently attended an

antenatal appointment to receive her vaccine and has this advice for expectant parents: "I would absolutely take the vaccine. It avoids so much stress and worry – and your baby doesn't even need to have a jab. I took the vaccine as soon as I could, and I didn't feel unwell at all."

Unwell at all." Tildy Ashcroft, Specialist Midwife for Antenatal and Newborn Screening at Warrington and Halton Teaching Hospitals, said: "The RSV vaccine is a fantastic way to protect babies at the most way to protect babies at the most can provide reassurance to parents. "As a midwife vulnerable time of their lives and would

encourage any expectant mum to speak to their midwife about the vaccinations that are available for you and your baby. We are always happy to answer any questions you have and are here to support you."

The RSV vaccine is offered alongside other maternal jabs jabs to protect expectant parents and babies from preventable illnesses. This includes vaccinations for flu, pertussis which protects against whooping cough, and COVID-19. Pregnant women are offered the

RSV vaccine to protect their baby from week 28 of pregnancy and only one dose is needed to give





When he was just 11, to the First Sea Lord, Sir Ben Key. In the light of his request, Warrington BC agreed to work with Warrington Litter Volunteers in agreeing to attempt to meet Thomas's One Tonne Challenge during the timeframe of the GBSC during March and early April during March and early April.

Litter picking can be an extremely enjoyable, healthy, open air experience with a range of

like-minded local people. It helps improve the look and feel of the town and often has the impact of leading to an improvement in ongoing littering, once an area has been tidied up. Litter picking can often remove plastics and other litter from entering local watercourses. Plastics take years and years to break down. Warrington sits on the banks of the River Mersey only a few miles from the Irish Sea; plastic debris falling into a stream or river in Warrington could easily find itself in months and years ahead causing major problems for water quality and marine life. -Spotlight on Local History with James Balme –

St. Elphin's Church – The final resting place of the 13th Baron of Warrington Sir John Boteler (Knight)

Anyone visiting Warrington today cannot fail to see the towering spire of St. Elphin's church that is visible for many miles around and dominating the landscape.

Reaching an impressive two hundred and eighty-one feet the spire can claim to be the 5th highest parish church spire in the UK. St. Elphin's is believed to have been first built around

16

650 AD as a place of worship. A mention in the Domesday Book of 1066 states that a priest was present at Warrington. Historical research reveals that

Historical research reveals that the first priest 'Elphin' was present at the church until his death in 679 AD. The church has been associated with several well-known Warrington families throughout time including the Masseys, and the Pattens. But it was the Boteler family of Bewsey old hall who founded the Lady Chapel at the church in the year 1290 AD and it was endowed by Sir John Boteler. In 1354 the church was rebuilt once again by Sir William Boteler and the earliest remains from that time can still be seen today in the chancel and crypt.

It was at Bewsey old hall in 1429 AD that a baby was born to John Boteler and his wife Isabel and this e landscape. baby also called John would one day become the 13th Baron of Warrington

Warrington. The child was to grow strong and as part of the Boteler family he represented a family that had been in Warrington and the surrounding area for many hundreds of years. By the age of twenty young John was to become a Knight of the Shire a noble position and one that he would hold for many years to come. On the 18th August 1444 John was to wed Lady Margaret Gerard of Kingsley, daughter of Sir Peter Gerard. Between them they bore at least five children, John, Margaret, Elizabeth, William and Isabel however in the year 1452 Lady Margaret was to die young. Sometime before July 1448 John was knighted and the ceremony was witnessed by his brother-in-Law Sir Thomas Gerard of Kingsley. John was to marry Margaret in August 1444.

John was to marry Margaret in August 1444, he was just fifteen years old and Margaret just fourteen. Sadly, Margaret passed away in 1452 aged just twenty two years. John married again to Elizabeth Dacre but this ended in divorce. John was to marry one more time and his third bride was Margaret Stanley but she survived John and it was at Bewsey Old Hall on the 24th February 1463 that Sir John died.

Upon his death Sir John was taken to St Elphin's church in Warrington where he was buried inside the church in a beautiful Alabaster tomb chest. The tomb still remains today and is lavishly decorated and surmounted with the effigies of Sir John and his first wife Lady Gerard of Kingsley both holding hands for eternity.

Financing Buy-to-Let Property Tax-Efficiently

For landlords and property investors, financing buy-to-let properties tax-efficiently is key to maximising returns. Whether using personal funds or external finance, understanding the tax treatment of interest and borrowing is essential.

Using Personal Capital

The simplest funding method is investing personal savings. With savings rates around 5%, after tax this drops to approximately 4% for basic rate taxpayers and 3% for higher-rate taxpayers. Buy-to-let investments can yield better returns, particularly when rental yields and capital growth are factored in.

However, using personal capital ties up funds for the long term, reducing flexibility. As a result, many landlords combine personal funds with mortgage borrowing to balance return and liquidity.

Remortgaging Existing Properties

HMRC treats property letting as a business. Its guidance (BIM45700) confirms that interest on loans used to fund property businesses is generally tax-deductible. Crucially, HMRC focuses on the purpose of the borrowing rather than the asset used as security.

For landlords with multiple properties, this means remortgaging an existing property to release capital for reinvestment typically allows continued interest relief. As long as the funds are used for the property rental business, interest remains allowable (subject to the standard restrictions and caps).

Portfolio Lending

Landlords with two or more properties may benefit from portfolio lending, where multiple mortgages are consolidated into one account. The lender assesses the portfolio as a whole, averaging rental income and loan-to-value ratios.

This structure enables landlords to leverage equity across the entire portfolio to finance further acquisitions. For instance, if a portfolio worth £2 million has £1.7 million in borrowing, there is £300,000 of equity available to support new investment.

Portfolio lending is generally aimed at landlords with portfolios valued between £500,000 and £10 million. Lenders typically require rental income to cover at least 130% of loan repayments. Rates are often competitive compared to individual buy-tolet mortgages, offering greater flexibility and efficiency in expanding property businesses.

Releasing Equity from a Main Residence

Landlords can also release equity from their principal private residence to finance buy-to-let investments. Mortgages secured against a main residence usually offer lower interest rates and fees compared to buy-to-let products.

Even though the loan is secured on

the home, interest can still qualify for tax relief if the funds are used wholly and exclusively for the rental business. This approach may appeal to smaller investors seeking cost-effective finance, particularly when refinancing a residential mortgage.

Using a SIPP for Property Investment

Self-Invested Personal Pensions (SIPPs) offer another avenue for property investment. A SIPP can either purchase commercial property directly or provide capital (from age 55 onwards) to the investor.

While SIPPs cannot purchase residential property, buying a commercial property—such as business premises—within a SIPP can be highly tax-efficient. Rent paid into the SIPP is exempt from income tax, capital gains are tax-free on disposal, and the property value remains within the pension fund, potentially outside the scope of Inheritance Tax.

Interest Relief on Borrowing

Since April 2020, individual landlords receive a basic rate tax credit of 20% on mortgage interest, rather than a deduction from rental profits. Relief applies to loans used directly or indirectly to acquire rental property, up to the property's market value when first let.

Interest on loans funding deposits may also qualify if the borrowing is for the rental business. Typically, lenders will finance up to 60-75%

of a buy-to-let property's value, with rental income expected to cover 125-145% of mortgage repayments.

Tax Credit Caps and Restrictions

The 20% tax credit is capped at the lower of:

- The interest paid in the tax year;
- The property business's taxable profits;
- Adjusted total income (after reliefs and losses, excluding savings and dividends) above the personal allowance.

If the tax credit exceeds the tax due, it is capped at the amount required to reduce the tax bill to nil. Any unused credit can be carried forward and applied in future tax years.

Where rental losses occur, interest relief cannot be claimed in that year, but the unused interest is carried forward for future offset when profits arise.

Practical Considerations

Borrowings must be used wholly and exclusively for the rental business to qualify for interest relief. Where loans are used for both personal and business purposes, interest deductibility can be complex and may be restricted.

Teenage Darts World Champion on top of the world!



LOCAL teengae darts sensation Luke Littler must be feeling on top of the world after becoming the youngest-ever darts world champion, being made an Honorary Citizen of Warrington and having his beloved "Warrington Wolves' stadium named in his honour for the opening game of the season.

The decision to bestow the prestigious honour on Luke was approved by all councillors at an extraordinary meeting of the council following a proposal put forward by council leader, Cllr Hans Mundry, seconded by deputy loader Cllr leader leader, Cllr Jean Flaherty.

Aged just 17 years and 347 days, Luke won the 2025 PDC World Darts Championship in January, defeating three-time world champion Michael Van Gerwen 7-3 in the final at Alexandra Palace in London.

He has now won 13 senior PDC Premier League, Grand Slam, and World Series Finals Champion.

Luke attended Padgate High and is a keen supporter of Warrington Wolves and was recently given the honour of having the Halliwell Jones Stadium named after him for

the opening game of the season. He first picked up a dart at 18 months old. Luke joined the St Helens Youth Darts Academy at the age of 8, and during this time

represented England's A team, at the WDF British Internationals, the MVG Masters, the 6 Nations, and

At 16, Luke reached the 2024 World Championship final and earned a spot in the 2024 Premier League. Luke won his first major title at the Premier League on his debut, becoming the youngest player to win a major PDC Tournament.

In 2024, he went on to win the World Series of Darts and the Grand Slam of Darts titles on his debut at both events, before securing the World Darts Championship at the start of this year.

Luke was named 2024 BBC Young Sports Personality of the year, and his achievements at such a young age have been credited with creating a surge in interest in darts, with the term 'Littlermania' being coined to explain the phenomenon.
