Editor's Comment

IT'S not often I comment on wider Warrington issues in this column but the findings of the Government's Best Value Inspection into the financial affairs of Warrington Borough Council, with debts of around £1.8 billion, is something that impacts the whole town.

While it was pleasing to see the council's leadership team accept the "serious findings" of the Best Value Inspection and promise "decisive action" one word has been missing from the council's response - and that word is "sorry."

So far, no apology has been issued to those who challenged and questioned the level of council debt and some of the high-risk investments.

In fact some of those who raised concerns, were often left to be made to feel like fools, so it is not surprising they are now asking for heads to roll.

heads to roll.

One of those who often challenged the council's financial position and investments was tormer Warrington South MP Andy Carter, who is indeed one of those making such calls.

While Labour leader Cllr. Hans

While Labour leader Cllr. Hans Mundry is saying decisive action is required and has already been working to reduce debt, he was also part of the Cabinet involved in making and approving these financial decisions.

His predecessor and deputy have long left the building and one has to wonder if they knew what was coming?

Accepting the recommendations

of the Government inspectors, Cllr Mundry says it contains important challenges and since taking over leadership of the council, "clear and deliberate steps have been taken to change its direction."

taken to change its direction."

The Best Value Inspection findings include concerns relating to governance, leadership, organisational culture, financial management, and commercial investment activity.

Government envoys will now oversee the ongoing work to try and balance the books but what we don't want is a knee jerk reaction with some of the investments which

give a good return on investment most notably Birchwood Park.

A marketing exercise is currently underway to evaluate the possible future sale of the business park - in my opinion while it would obviously generate some much-needed revenue, the ongoing revenues it generates would be much better in the long-term, as the value and returns are only going to go in one direction.

direction.

Meanwhile, it would be refreshing if someone from the corridors of power could issue a much-needed apology to the people of Warrington for this financial mess, while also looking how to improve revenues from existing assets without making drastic cuts.





bombed the area as Lancaster bombers were made there. Later, Peel Holdings bought the area and turned it into the Trafford shopping mecca.

There is a ski centre, Media City, a new controversial bridge, The Quays, with apartments. and so much more. Not forgetting the Ship Canal influence.

Although the de Traffords moved away, they all seem to have married well, some with near Royal connections, but far from their northern home.

New look and feel to brand new menu at historic Raven Inn

THE arrival of Spring has seen The Raven Inn at Glazebury, Warrington, deliver its own new 'look and feel', with a brand new food menu, 7-daysa-week opening and further additions to its repertoire of events.

The Raven Inn is one of the oldest pubs in the North West, with archival records showing it started as an Inn in the 16th century, with some notable regulars such as Colonel Blood, famous for stealing the Crown Jewels.

The pub was acquired by the Raven Inn Community Benefit Society (CBS) and now, fully renovated and under new management, it is in its 3rd year of operation.

The pub's new menu features the already popular Peppered Chicken, Steak Frites and Lamb Chops. Food is served daily and the pub now boasts a new vegan-only menu, the first zero-alcohol draught bear in the area, as well as additional garden seating from where you can enjoy lovely summer sunsets. Last month the CBS hosted a
