



## Exciting plan to combine 14 churches in Winwick Deanery into one parish

DETAILS of a proposal to combine the 14 churches in the Winwick Deanery into one single parish under a Fit for Mission Initiative proposed by the Liverpool Diocese were discussed at a packed meeting of the congregations from the churches involved, at St Peter's Church, Newton-le-Willows.

Described as an "exciting development, members of the clergy and parishioners from the deanery area were welcomed by the Arch deacon of St Helens and Warrington, Simon Fisher, to hear details of the project and the progress made with neighbouring Fit for Mission schemes in St. Helens and West Derby.

A question and answer session with a team of representatives from the Diocese and St Helens churches provided information on experience of setting up a new joint parish and the benefits involved.

The churches involved in the Winwick deanery include: St Oswald's Church, Winwick; Newchurch, Culcheth; Christ Church, Croft; All Saints, Glazebury; St John's, Earlestown; All Saints, Newton; St. Peter's, Newton; St. Peter's, Newton; St. Emmanuel Wargrave; St. Michael's, Burtonwood; St Luke's, Lowton; St Mary's, Lowton; St Thomas, Golborne; St. Helens, Hollinfare; St. James, Haydock. Emmanuel

Reverend Martin Cox, priest in charge of St Oswald's church and the Deanery of Winwick and rector of Christ Church, Croft and Newchurch, Culcheth,

envisaged the formation of the large single parish as an exciting development for the mission and ministry of the Church of England in the Winwick Deanery. He said: "The Fit for Mission project will introduce a new culture through a large single parish. It will effect closer connections between member churches who will be strengthened by joint resources and specialist advice. The two-year lead in will enable us to address common concerns related to such a significant change in Church of England Parish life. Looking to the future I feel that this is a really important opportunity for us to shape our parishes to ensure that we continue to serve all people who

live in our diverse communities."

Details of the scheme have been submitted to all the churches concerned under the Liverpool Diocese "Fit for Mission" project. Its aim will be to provide a secure framework of finance and expertise to enable the stronger and combined deanery to meet the challenges

many of today's churches. The churches who decide to join will benefit from financial support and expertise provided by the diocese plus professional assistance with the setting up of new management systems which will enable the church network to function efficiently and provide more time for the mission care the church provides.

The churches involved will be

asked for their decision on whether to take part in October this year after which there will be a two year lead in of intensive planning during 2026 and 2027 to prepare for the introduction of the new, functioning

He said it was "shameful" that the village had been allowed to get in such a poor state



### The Sealed Knot returns bigger and

Following the fantastic response to their first event in 2024, the Earl of Manchester's Regiment of Foote once again will bring the sights, sounds and smells of the English Civil Wars to this close knit community in the rolling fields of Culcheth.

Be transported back in time with a tented encampment, watch displays of pike, musket and cannon, see demonstrations of traditional skills, and discover what life was like in the age of

what life was like in the age of Roundheads and Cavaliers!
Located on Mill Fields opposite the Raven Inn on Warrington Road – and within easy reaching distance of Warrington, Leigh, Newton-le-Willows St Helens, and Manchester – don't miss discovering more about the history. discovering more about the history under your feet in a place where Parliamentarians and Royalists Royalists once clashed in 1651!

Opening hours: 11am-4pm

The history: In September 1651, two thousand defeated Scots from the Battle of Worcester were escaping north, harassed and picked-off along the way. Five hundred Scots crossed the River Mersey at Hollin Ferry and, following the track just west of the Glaze Brook, traversed the next obstacle – Jibcroft Brook, five miles north at The Raven Inn. The Scots were now deep in enemy territory.
Alerted to the troop movements,
Lord John Holcroft and his men
ambushed them from land adjacent to The Raven. Given the difference

in troop numbers, the ambush was probably little more than musket and small cannon fire. In 1905 a 'Minion' canon ball was found at nearby Moss House Farm (which must have been fired at point blank range) and in 2019 several musket balls were detected opposite the Raven by detectorist Sean Holcroft. The 3" diameter ball is on display in Warrington Museum.

One historical character associated with the site is Captain Thomas Blood who married one

of the Holcroft daughters. Because the Raven Inn was later described in 1770 as 'ancient', it is more than likely that John Holcroft and Thomas Blood frequented The Raven for their ale. But that wasn't the end of Blood's story: he remained a military man, rising to the rank of Colonel and later hatched 'a dashing plan' to steal the Crown Jewels in 1671, which ended in abject failure. Surprisingly, he was not hanged for his crime but gained a good deal of notoriety.

### Sundial members given fascinating insight into history of Warrington women

Sundial WI met at Newchurch Parish Hall on June 17 when members were given fascinating insight into history of Warrington women.

President Eileen Griffiths Members welcomed "Jerusalem" was sung before the speaker, Philip Jeffs, began his talk

on "Warrington Women".

Philip, the Borough Archivist, explained how the archives arranged the data and after some ideas from the Sundial audience he showed slides about Warrington women from the late 18th century through to the mid 1940s.

He made a start in 1921 with Mrs Graham Hutchinson, the first female magistrate in Lancashire. (She was based in Grappenhall.)

The Warrington Guardian gave lots of details about her husband but not about her! In fact she had set up Baby Boxes to help hard-up mothers and had worked in a soldiers' convalescent home in World War 1.

The photo of the Borough Anniversary showed one woman, the Mayor's wife.

Philip then showed "fields" of activity like poetry, teaching, suffragettes and suffragists, Red Cross work, and charity work. Members heard about Anna Laetitia Barbauld, Hannah Phillips who laid out cholars vicine. who laid out cholera victims,

Mabel Capper, the first woman journalist in the Guardian and Dr Mary Anderson ,workhouse patients then later soldiers with VD in Whitehouse Hospital. Hannah Young in the 1800s made so much money with her cookery and household management books that her husband took her name! Philip welcomes any suitable entries. Eileen thanked him and he judged the competition – a Warrington the competition – a Warrington Artefact. Aileen Paterson and Roma

Etherington came first and second. After tea Brenda Pinion gave details about summer and autumn trips. ### Bungalows plan approved – despite objections from parish council

PLANNING chiefs at Warrington have given the go-ahead to plans for two detached bungalows at Croft – despite objections from the parish council.

The two dwellings are set to be built on land at the junction of Lady Lane and Mustard Lane and will be

Lane and Mustard Lane and will be adjacent to the Grade 2 Listed St Lewis' RC Church.

There are two other listed buildings nearby – St Lewis' Presbytery and an 18th-century well in the garden of a house.

The church and presbytery date from 1827.

Croft Parish Council objected

Croft Parish Council objected on the grounds of proximity to the Listed buildings, traffic issues, over-development of the site and the fact that the new properties would not be in keeping with the Listed buildings

Members of the borough's development management committee were told the site was previously a builder's yard.

It was highly sustainable, being within walking distance of a bus

Although there is an access to Mustard Lane, access for the new properties would be via a shared driveway to Lady Lane. Existing hedges would be retained to provide privacy.

The site was surrounded by other dwellings, the church and the associated St Lewis' RC Primary School.

Planning officers recommended the scheme be approved as it was not inappropriate in the Green Belt and would not have any adverse impact on neighbouring properties.
