Editor's Comment

THE year is 2025 and the UK is meant to be a place of freedom of expression.

During my recent visit to Warrington Pride I was shocked and horrified by the level of homophobia and abuse directed at our LGBTQ+ community.

Numerous comments posted under a short video of the event I published on our Facebook page made me feel like I had been teleported back in time to the 1960s.

I had to monitor proceedings and spent a great deal of time deleting and hiding many of the comments, while also leaving some in public to help expose those responsible for their vile rants.

Comments ranged from "Who cares about this gay s**t" to "What a load of boll**ks, who wants to see this" and others I feel unable to publish.

l've worked as a journalist for ore than 40 years and consider more myself broad-minded but some of the comments were truly appalling.

It certainly left my pride in my home town dented, realising these people, with no tolerance for how others lead their lives, walk amongst

us. We have already seen people sent to prison for inciting hatred on social media – but clearly not enough to become a deterrent.

From what I could see, everyone taking part was having a great time and it certainly brought plenty of colour and music spread across the town centre in Golden Square and Times Square, generating lots of much-needed income for local of much-needed income for businesses.

Those who felt it necessary to nose who reir in necessary to post their vile abusive on social media have achieved one thing – my full support whenever possible for everything PRIDE related in Warrington and beyond. I will also be spending some time weeding out the serial offenders so they can no longer view or comment

they can no longer view or comment on our social media posts - and will consider referring the worst offenders to the local police to see if they warrant further action.

If you don't want to celebrate or support PRIDE that is your freedom of expression but here at Warrington-Worldwide we will not tolerate homophobia or personal attacks on people based on their gender or

choice of gender.

Here's looking next year's PRIDE forward to next year's PRIDE event and congratulations to all involved in organising a vibrant event for our town centre. *While freedom of expression

Tributes paid following sudden death of "brilliant" journalist Pete Magill

TRIBUTES are being paid to "determined", "tenacious" and "brilliant" journalist Pete Magill from Warrington, who has died suddenly aged just 49.

A stalwart of the regional media, Pete Magill worked across numerous news outlets. He began in Warrington, working for Orbit News, publisher of Warrington Worldwide, before moving to the Warrington Guardian, then to newspapers in Oldham, Burnley and East Lancashire. Most recently, Pete was promoted to Head of Print for the North West and North Wales for Newsquest and managed the print edition of the Lancashire Telegraph and sister titles such as the Bury Times.

Pete was a hugely respected colleague, renowned for his work ethic, never shying away from covering council meetings late into the night, trawling agendas for the hidden stories, and keeping the closest eye on criminal court

listings. A huge Warrington Wolves fan, he followed his club through good times and bad with his loyal rugby crew. He loved to travel, for work and pleasure, with his passport being stamped in locations as varied as America, Australia and Israel.

His passion for the job was endless and he willingly shared his knowledge. One former Warrington Guardian colleague, Suzanne Elsworth, said: "Pete was

the one who took me to court in my first weeks as a news reporter when I was petrified about ending up in the dock rather than on the press bench. He had contacts everywhere, building up trusted relationships over many years and always being that 'critical friend' who held the authorities to account who held the authorities to account, sharing their good news but seeking out the truth when things went bad.

"As our careers progressed, we stayed great mates, even when we were competing for the same promotion. He was always there when I'd ask for a cheesy pun or random headline if I ran out of ideas. Despite living far apart, we'd meet for good food and even better chat when our paths could cross.

"I can't believe I'm talking about Pete in the past tense. He was devoted to his job, the rugby, a proper pint of real ale, and to his family. I can't believe we will never share any more late-night gossipy texts, or have the request for my address – the one thing he never seemed to jot down in his contacts book – ahead of the annual Christmas card exchange. We're raising a glass of questionably-flavoured craft beer to you Pete. You will be missed.

Gareth Dunning, Warrington Guardian deputy editor, took over Warrington as news editor from Pete more than 20 years ago. He said: "Pete and I became good friends when I started at the Academy. He would pass on his knowledge of Warrington, and his thirst for news. "Long before the days of 24-

hour news, Pete would be out at 11 pm if he heard about a story. You could drop Pete into a town centre anywhere in the UK and within an hour he would have had four page

leads and a splash. "He lived and breathed news. Tales of him sleeping in the Crewe office after deadline are legendary.

"After leaving Warrington, he wrote a much-loved Podium column in the Warrington Guardian which had those in authority shaking in their boots. Yet he kept the respect of everyone, even when being critical.

"He came and worked in our office a couple of weeks back. He was looking forward to Wembley, we exchanged glances of bemusement as we heard young reporters discuss Charlie XCX and Tiktok.

"He never changed and it is hard to think I won't see him in the newsroom again.

Pete attended Thomas Boteler High School in Warrington and, after a short apprenticeship on a local paper, began his career at Orbit News with its founders David

and Gary Skentelbery. Gary said: "To hear that a former colleague who started as your office junior has died so suddenly and young is heart-breaking. On the one hand, you have my father who is still working aged 87 who trained us both and then Pete taken from us so young. I can't even begin to think what his family must be feeling at this time.

"Although Pete left us to join the Warrington Guardian as we embarked on our own journey with Warrington Worldwide, we always kept in touch with a friendly rivalry.

"Pete was never afraid to express his opinion and was one of the most hard-working determined journalists I have ever met."

Council apologises after rare orchids mown down in error



WARRINGTON Borough Council has issued an apology after rare orchids on Birchwood Way were mown down in error and plans are now in action to protect them moving forward.

The issue was flagged by former Mayor Geoff Settle, Chair of Warrington Nature Conservation Forum who expressed regret that the town is unlikely to see many rare orchids this year – because the grasses they thrive in have been mown down for a second successive year.

successive year. Mr Settle has been trying for several years to protect the orchids after receiving complaints from residents when he was a Poulton North borough councillor.

Despite a promise last year from Warrington Borough Council that grass verges where the rare Bee orchids and Northern Marsh orchids grow would not be mown, the same happened again this year. A Warrington Borough Council spokesperson said: "We're very sorry to confirm that a section of wild orchids on Birchwood Way were cut down in error."

wild orchids on Birchwood Way were cut down in error." "We plan to protect these areas in the future by installing physical barriers to prevent mowing until the end of the summer when the plants have flowered and set seed."

Meanwhile, Mr Settle said: "Hopefully next year we can see the bee orchids once more in their full glory! "What I am pleased about is the

TEDxWarrington is back for 2025! Event plans have been launched with a brand new theme and an exciting partnership with Warrington Youth Zone.

Local businesswoman, Kirsty James, has once again secured a coveted licence from TED to run TEDxWarrington. 2024 saw a pause in events as she attended a TED conference in the US to upgrade her licence. She also became a TEDx speaker in her own right at another location, allowing her to 'walk the talk' and support the growth of the Warrington event even further.

Kirsty commented, "I'm over the moon to be bringing TEDxWarrington back for 2025 to give opportunity and profile to my home town. Volunteer team members and associates across the Warrington area have now reunited and the social channels and website are packed with new information."

TEDxWarrington 2025 will run on the evening of Tuesday 2nd December 2025 and the team is delighted to be working closely with Warrington Youth Zone who will be hosting the event at their site on Dallam Lane in the centre of Warrington. Birdnesting

Whilst this is definitely not an article on ornithology the concept of birdnesting in divorce gets its name from bird parents who keep their chicks safe in a nest and alternately fly in and out in caring for them. Birdnesting, in the context of divorce, is a co-parenting arrangement where parents take turns residing in the family home with the children while the other parent lives elsewhere.

The children remain in their familiar home and the parents rotate in and out, aiming to minimise disruption and maintain a sense of stability for the children.

The primary goal is to keep the children's environment as stable as possible during a divorce/separation. This minimises disruption for them and provides them with the security of knowing they get to sleep in their own bed each night. In cases where birdnesting is agreed it is typically treated as a temporary solution while longer term living arrangements are being worked out.

One parent lives in the family home with the children while on a rotational basis the other resides/stays temporarily elsewhere. The children's home remains the same providing a sense of security for them during an otherwise unsettling time.

However, there are some obvious challenges with this sort of arrangement. For it to work there must be effective communication between the parents. There must be mutual trust, but which is so often absent in divorce, and careful thought needs to be given to meeting/sharing the expense of the arrangement - the expense of the family home and perhaps also the expense of living elsewhere depénding on where elsewhere is.

Birdnesting can be a viable co-parenting temporary option for some families. It's obviously not for everyone, probably not for most, but it might be worth a try for some. It requires careful planning, open communication and a willingness on the part of both parents to work together.

AI technology helps speed up diagnosis of skin cancer



Al technology is now being used to help speed up the diagnosis of skin cancer in Warrington.

Bridgewater Community Healthcare NHS Foundation Trust neatincare INFS Foundation Trust and Warrington and Halton Teaching Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust are using the latest in Al technology to provide patients with a swifter diagnosis of skin cancer.

A rise in skin cancer referrals is resulting in a high demand for dermatology services across NHS organisations in England, including

locally in Warrington. Since 2022, the dermatology service (which is run by Bridgewater Community Healthcare) is now averaging over 300 patient referrals per month, with approximately half resulting in further testing and treatment in to conditions such as skin cancer.

This new NHS partnership with artificial intelligence technology Skin Analytics uses e, NICE-recommended provider cutting-edge, Al by recognising cancerous, precancerous and common harmless skin conditions through photographic

images. Resulting in faster diagnosis, this state-of-the-art system called DERM, is impressively 99.9% accurate when ruling out melanoma and 97% sensitive when detecting skin cancer.

When visiting the service, patients have images taken of their mole or skin lesion at a dedicated 'Photo Hub Clinic'. These are then inputted into the DERM system and assessed using Al.

Those with common harmless skin conditions are quickly discharged without having to see a consultant. If, however, the DERM system flags any skin lesions as potentially pre-malignant or malignant, the patient will receive faster access to care, with some treatment performed on

Acting as a 'one-stop clinic', not only is the service a first of its kind across the NHS Cheshire and Merseyside region; its location in a local shopping centre makes it more

unique. Warrington Halton and Centre (a Diagnostics service provided by Warrington and Halton Teaching Hospitals) is located at Halton Health Hub, within Runcorn Shopping City. This is one of only a small number of NHS community diagnostic centres to be launched inside a shopping centre in the country, and as such is another first for the NHS Cheshire and Merseyside region. Dr Paul Fitzsimmons is joint

Medical Director for Bridgewater Community Healthcare and Warrington and Halton Teaching Hospitals. He said: "Skin cancer is the most frequently referred cancer speciality within the NHS, and we're experiencing this increase firsthand across Warrington.

"The rise in suspected skin cancer referrals has been placing increased

ressure on our dermatology service. "To better manage this growing demand, the partnership we have created with Skin Analytics has offered a valuable opportunity to work creatively by using effective, cutting-edge AI healthcare cutting-edge innovation.

"Not only does this AI technology speed up diagnosis and possible on-the-day treatment; the fact the service is located, not in a hospital but inside a modern diagnostic facility within a shopping centre, showcases how healthcare is able to reach out into our local communities.

Dan Mullarkey, Medical Director at Skin Analytics said:"At Skin Analytics, we believe every patient deserves access to fast and effective

Adding a special touch to the occasion, the event was organised by Holly Pirrie, a Warrington local herself.

Reflecting on the event, Holly said:"It was such a pleasure to host the Miss International UK finals once again in my hometown. Sixty incredible women competed for the title, and we have a wonderful winner, Sophie, who will represent them and the UK on the Miss International stage in Japan later this year."

After the finalists took part in interviews, photoshoots, and their on-stage rounds, Sophie Wallace, from Glasgow, Scotland, was crowned the new Miss International UK 2025/26. It was a dream come true for Sophie, who had returned for a second attempt at the title and proved that perseverance truly pays off.

A trailblazer in every sense, Sophie is a journalist, broadcaster, PR manager, and model who has spent the past decade championing representation in the media. 



Spotlight on Local History with James Balme

A wander to Wonderland on the trail of Lewis Carroll



It was in the year of 1827 when Charles Dodgson of Daresbury, Warrington was to marry Frances Jane Lutwidge. Frances went on to give birth to seven girls and four boys during their marriage.

marriage. On the 27th January 1832 their third son was born at All Saints' vicarage in Daresbury and his name was Charles Lutwidge Dodgson. In his later life he was to become world famous as a writer of childrens' fiction whilst a lecturer at Oxford University under the pen name of Lewis Carroll notably publishing his works 'Alice in Wonderland' and 'Through the Looking Glass'. In his early years Charles could often be seen playing between the gravestones in the churchyard of All Saints church in the village. His father was the perpetual curate at the church and Charles would often play outside whilst his father saw to matters within the church.


Young Charles was educated at home rather than attending school. He was an avid reader and extremely intelligent. He suffered with a stammer that had an effect upon his social life throughout his later years. His father was a much-loved vicar of the church and serving sixteen years of his life at All Saints preaching to the parishoners of the village. But it was at the young age of just eleven years old when his father accepted a new position in Stockton-on-lees in the North Riding of Yorkshire meaning that Charles would no longer be able to play around in the grounds of the church or hide behind the old gravestones. The whole family was to move to the North Riding recovery where

The whole family was to move to the North Riding rectory where they made it their new home and remained there for the next twentyfive years. At the age of twelve Charles was to attend Richmond school in North Yorkshire where he was to study hard in the years to come before eventually entering the University of Oxford in 1849. In later life his fame increased as his written works attracted worldwide recognition. By the time he reached his sixties Charles suffered severe illness that led to the loss of his ability to walk for much of the time and leaving him bed-ridden for weeks and sometimes months. It was on 14th January 1898 whilst staying at his sister's home in Guilford that Charles died of pneumonia. Charles was buried at nearby Mount cemetery in Guilford.

The church at Daresbury that we see today was entirely rebuilt in 1872, however the original tower remains intact and is believed to date back to 1550 AD. Within the churchyard stand many tombstones that pre-date the current church including one simply marked in memory of Elizabeth and dated to 1703

Today there stands within the grounds of All Saints church at Daresbury 'The Lewis Carroll centre' dedicated to the work and memory of Charles Lutwidge Dodgson. People from around the world come to visit the centre and to see for themselves the Lewis Carroll church window in the church.

Director ID Verification: What every UK company Director needs to know

Over the coming months, you'll likely see more news and notifications from Companies House about a significant change in company law: all company directors in the UK will soon be required to verify their identity.

This new obligation applies to directors of all companies whether you're running a trading business, a consultancy, a property investment vehicle, or a residents' management company. It's part of sweeping reforms introduced under the Economic Crime and Corporate Transparency Act 2023 (ECCTA), aimed at increasing transparency and tackling economic crime across the UK's corporate landscape.

Why is this happening?

Companies House is evolving from a passive registrar of company information into a more active gatekeeper of corporate integrity. Identity verification will form a key part of that role. The aim is simple: to make it harder for fraudulent or criminal individuals to hide behind UK company structures.

In practical terms, it means that every director—new or

existing—will need to prove they are who they say they are.

When does it take effect?

Although the requirement becomes mandatory from autumn 2025, directors can already verify their ID voluntarily as of April 2025. For newly formed companies and newly appointed directors, verification will be a compulsory step from the autumn. For directors of existing companies, there will be a transition period with a final deadline expected in autumn 2026.

How does verification work?

The verification process is designed to be quick and straightforward. Most directors will use the free GOV.UK ID Check app, which works with biometric documents such as a UK photocard driving licence, UK biometric residence permit or a passport (UK or international, as long as it has a chip). The app scans your ID and uses facial recognition technology to confirm your identity.

If using the app isn't an option, verification can also be completed at selected Post Office branches or by answering security questions online. Accountants and other authorised agents can complete verification on behalf of directors, although this may incur a fee.

Once verified, each director will be issued a unique identification number by Companies House. This number will need to be quoted on future filings such as confirmation statements and company accounts. Without it, documents simply won't be accepted.

What happens if a director doesn't verify?

Failing to comply with identity verification will be a criminal offence. Companies that allow unverified directors to continue acting on their behalf could also find themselves in breach of the law. Penalties may include financial sanctions or even disqualification.

Until verification is complete, a director should not undertake any formal duties or make decisions on behalf of the company. Given that the whole process can take just a few minutes, the risks of delay far outweigh the inconvenience.

Taking action now

While there's no need for panic—transitional deadlines mean there's time to act—it's important for directors to understand their responsibilities early and avoid a last-minute rush.

If you're unsure whether you're listed as a director (for example, if you took on a role informally or some time ago), it's easy to check your status for free on the Companies House website. No login is required.

Likewise, if you act as a director for more than one company, you'll only need to complete the process once. Your unique ID will apply across all your directorships.

This is one of the most significant compliance changes in recent years. While it's primarily administrative, it underlines a broader shift in how UK companies are regulated and monitored. Wolves suffer more Wembley heartbreak



WARRINGTON Wolves suffered heartbreak at Wembley for the second successive year as Mikey Lewis' late conversion won the game for Hull KR.

Unlike last year, Warrington pushed the game all the way and despite being unfancied, led for a long time in the game thanks to Josh Thewlis' first half try. But with barely two minutes left, Tyrone May's kick bobbled around in-goal and Tom Davies touched the loose ball down within inches of it

loose ball down within inches of it going dead, and Lewis stepped up to add the decisive two points from wide out to win it 8-6 for Willie

Peters' side. George Williams made his return well ahead of schedule tollowing from injury, and he was part of a lively opening from the Wolves before the arrival of teeming rain changed the nature of the game.

Warrington enjoyed the better of the early exchanges and had a try shout referred to the video referee when the ball came loose from a Jack Broadbent carry and was touched down by Adam Holroyd in-goal, but replays showed Rodrick Tai had stripped the ball illegally and instead

stripped the ball filegally and instead a penalty was awarded to the Robins. Hull KR struggled to get field position in the opening quarter but they did end the stalemate on 24 minutes through a Mikey Lewis penalty, after Ben Currie had tackled him high.

It turned in to a war of attrition in the first half and it looked like 2-0 might be the half time score until a spiralling Marc Sneyd kick was spilled by Joe Burgess five metres from his own line to gift Warrington a full set of six and they made it pay.

There was fortune to it, Sneyd's low kick attempt came off the foot off Jez Litten and spun out to the right hand side and in to the hands of Josh Thewlis to catch and dive in at the corner, with Sneyd adding the touchline conversion to make it 6-2 at the break.

Hull KR came out with renewed vigour in the second half but they couldn't find a way through, and soon Sneyd started managing the game perfectly with his kicking game on his way to winning the Lance Todd Trophy for a third time.

There was a blip when after Sneyd forced a drop out, Arron Lindop let Hull KR out of jail when Lewis' drop out bounced in to touch.

Hull KR came close when Jez Litten's kick came back off a post Litten's kick came back off a post and was put dead by Sam Powell, but largely the game was at the other end of the field, with Sneyd forcing multiple drop outs and then a Williams chip kick looking for Matt Dufty was diffused by Jack Broadbent.

Warrington were still holding on to their four point lead and Hull KR snatched it at the death through Davies to leave the Warrington fans heartbroken in the wet.

Sneyd received the Lance Todd Man-of-the-Match award for a record third time - but it was little compensation for defeat after an outstanding performance from the kicking ace.
