# Feathered friends visit day nursery

CHILDREN at Dunky's Day Nursery, Culcheth, had a very exciting and educational morning - thanks to a visit from some very special feathered friends.

One of the nursery families brought in their pet chickens, and

the children were absolutely thrilled to meet Henrietta, Skye, and Olive.

Nursery Manager Vicki Foy said: "The visit from the chickens sparked curiosity and laughter as the children had the chance to stroke, feed, and interact with the

chickens up close.
"They also learned some interesting chicken facts including why chickens have a comb on top of their head and a wattle underneath their beak. The children listened intently and asked thoughtful questions about how to care for them. This hands-on experience brought learning to life

in the most exciting way.

"The visit wasn't just fun, it was also rich in educational value and supported several areas of the Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS), including Social and Emotional

Development.

"Caring for living creatures encourages children to develop kindness and empathy. The children showed amazing gentleness and respect while handling the chickens and asked lots of questions about how to care for them.

"Interacting with animals help reduce anxiety. Some of our children with Special Educational

(SEN) were especially engaged and calm during the visit showing just how powerful animal interactions can be

"Experiences like this help children build a relationship with the natural world and understand

how we care for living things.
"We also talked about how the different foods we make at nursery that use eggs, encouraging the children to think about where their food comes from. Being involved in the care of chickens also promotes interest in nutrition and farm-to-table concepts."

# Stepping back in time at The Battle of Winwick

MEMBERS of the public were taken back in time as part of Heritage Weekend events at St Oswald's Church to relive the Battle of Winwick, a key turning point in the English Civil War, on August 19, 1648.

Musket shots and the smell of gunpowder filled the air as members of the Battle of Winwick Society and the Sealed Knot were on hand with living history displays, period uniforms, and weaponry

demonstrations.

The Battle of Winwick was a pivotal but often overlooked English Civil War engagement that occurred in the surrounding fields.

occurred in the surrounding tields. The event, was part of the national Heritage Open Days initiative.

The Battle of Winwick, or Red Bank, was the final clash of the Second English Civil War. It saw Oliver Cromwell's New Model Army defeat a Scottish army that was retreating south ofter an initial was retreating south after an initial loss at the Battle of Preston just two

days earlier.

The pursuit: Having marched southwards, the exhausted Scottish royalist infantry made a desperate

stand at Winwick against the pursuing Parliamentarians.

The outcome: The intense, close-The outcome: The intense, close-quarters fighting lasted for hours. The Scottish force was ultimately overrun, with thousands killed or captured. This decisive victory for Cromwell led to the surrender of the remaining royalist forces and sealed the fate of King Charles I, who would be executed a few months later. months later.

The battleground, which includes the fields near St Oswald's Church, was added to the Register of Historic Battlefields in 2018. It is considered the best-preserved Second English Civil War battlefield.

St Oswald's Church, a Grade I listed building with a history stretching back to Saxon times, played a direct role in the 1648 battle. During the conflict, the medieval church was used as a


prison to hold hundreds of captured Scottish soldiers.

The church's tower still bears scars, possibly from musket ball impacts, though these may date to an earlier 1643 skirmish. While many hundreds died

in the fighting, the only known battlefield casualty to be buried at St Oswald's was Major John Cholmley, a Cromwellian soldier. A new memorial plaque was unveiled in his and other fallen soldiers honour.

# Shock after residents excluded from parish council meeting

A councillor has expressed shock after local residents were prevented from entering a parish council meeting at Culcheth Library.

Independent Councillor Neil Johnson has expressed his shock after a video was circulated on social media showing what he describes as "chaos at the Parish Council".

The video, filmed outside Culcheth Library, shows a number of residents from the Protect Culcheth Village Campaign Group being denied entry to the Culcheth & Glazebury Parish Council meeting.

Cllr Johnson had given his apologies for the meeting in advance, due to an urgent family commitment. However, he described the video as "appalling".

In a statement, Cllr Johnson.

In a statement, Cllr Johnson said:"I am truly disheartened by what I have learned about this week's meeting of Culcheth and Glazebury Parish Council.

week's meeting of Culcheth and Glazebury Parish Council.

"I had given my apologies for this meeting in advance as I had to attend an urgent family commitment. I am truly sorry that I was not there, given what I have seen since.

"The video that has circulated is shocking and appalling. There was chaos at the Parish Council!

"Residents being locked out of the meeting and told they can not attend is plain and simple wrong. I have spoken about the attitude and conduct of this Parish Council in the past. I feel justified in having

"The Parish Council knew that a large number of people planned to attend. It should have been held in a bigger venue, as I expected it to be. I suggested as much, but this

was obviously ignored.

"I will now be asking for an investigation into what transpired. I will also be asking whether there has been a breach of the Public Bodies (Admission to Meetings) Act 1960.

Meanwhile, Gill Stott from the Protect Culcheth Village group circulated an "Open letter" to the parish council on social media, tollowing the incident, raising several concerns and issues.

She said the Protect Culcheth Village group 'advertised' the Parish Council meeting on social media to raise awareness of the meeting.

meeting.
"To claim that you did not expect
the numbers that turned out is

disingenuous.
"The Parish Council was fully aware of the number of people that attended the Community Meeting at the Daten on the 11th August (230 people) and only 3 of the 9 Parish Councillors attended that, the Town Hall on the 14th August



and at the photo shoot for the Culcheth Life Magazine on 24th August, at which only four parish councillors attended.

"It is not unreasonable to expect that you should have anticipated a higher than usual number of people and should have planned for that scenario accordingly."

scenario accordingly."

She went on to say: "I also stated that the Protect Culcheth Village group want to work with the Parish Council, not against them, but the actions of the Parish Council last night does make me wonder if the feeling is mutual as no response was forthcoming from the Chair to working tragether."

working together."

Labour Cllrs. issued a statement after the meeting saying: "A public call to attend, organised by a local Facebook group, unfortunately led to an attendance that exceeded the capacity of our usual meeting space. Due to fire regulations, the room can only accommodate 24

people. We understand that this may have been frustrating, but please be respectful of your Parish Councillors and Parish Council employees.

"Your Labour Councillors are here to listen and help, as every Parish Councillor is. We share your concerns regarding the CPS Centre. It is important to note that this specific issue was not on the agenda for the meeting. At present, we are not aware of any new proposals from the building's owner. As soon as we have anything to share we will let residents know.

"To propose an agenda item to the Chair of the Parish Council, please contact the clerk at least 10 days prior to the monthly Parish Council meeting. Relating to the CPS Centre, this would be most beneficial once we have information about the owners' future plans."
