Warburton Toll Bridge charges set to resume

ALMOST a year after major upgrade works were announced, normal operations are due to resume on Warburton Toll Bridge, with tolls expected to come into effect again on Thursday, 25

Major improvements have been carried out over the last few months to modernise the bridge and ensure seamless connectivity Trafford and Warrington

The former 12p toll rate, which was one of the lowest in England and set by an Act of Parliament in 1863 has increased to £1, although a 50% concessions will be available in the local area.

Upgrades include full road resurfacing, steel reinforcement, waterproofing, vegetation clearance, signage and the installation of new technology to facilitate digital payments.

The bridge toll – which has also been suspended for all users since

works began in October last year -

will now apply again. The cost is £1 pe per passage for all applicable vehicles and will be capped at a maximum of £2 per day
The new toll will cover future

and repair ensure the maintenance work required to bridge remains safe and operational.

A discount scheme has also been introduced for local residents, with Risley (WA3 6), Lymm (WA13 9) and Partington (M31 4) postcodes entitled to a 50% discount.

The works took place following approval from the Department for Transport to upgrade the bridge and update the toll rate, the outcome of an inquiry held by the Department into the matter in 2022.

spokesperson Manchester Ship Canal Company said: "The works carried out on Warburton Toll Bridge will significantly reduce congestion in the area, improve traffic flows and provide a more efficient crossing

"Road users in Warrington and Trafford have long demanded a

modern crossing that meets their needs, and that is what has been delivered. We remain grateful to residents and road users for their patience while we carried out this essential upgrade, which will vastly improve the service."



Your pet questions answered

How can I keep my pet safe during Halloween festivities?

Halloween can be a fun time for the whole family, but it can also present certain risks for pets.

Chocolate and other can be toxic to pets. Make sure all Halloween treats are stored securely and well out of reach of curious noses. If you suspect your pet has ingested something harmful, contact us immediately.

If you plan to dress your pet in a costume, ensure it fits well and doesn't restrict movement, breathing or vision. Some pets may find costumes stressful, so if your pet seems uncomfortable, it's best to skip

this altogether.

With the doorbell ringing and strangers in costumes, Halloween can be overwhelming for pets. Create a be overwhelming for pets. Create a safe, quiet space for your pet to retreat to if they become anxious. If your pet suffers severely with anxiety, please contact us to discuss how we can help manage this.

What should I consider when walking my dog in the dark?

As the days get shorter in October, many pet owners find themselves walking their dogs in the dark.

Equip your dog with a reflective collar, lead or harness. You can also use LÉD collars or attach small lights to your dog's gear to make them more visible to motorists and other pedestrians.

Stick to familiar routes that are well lit to avoid any hazards that may be difficult to see in the dark, such as uneven pavements or debris.

October is a time when many wild animals, like deer, are more active, especially at dawn and dusk. Keep your dog on a lead to prevent them from chasing wildlife and getting lost



How can I help my pet transition as temperatures drop?

As the weather cools, it's important help your pet adjust to the changing temperatures.

Make sure your pet has a warm, comfortable place to sleep, especially if they usually sleep on the floor. Consider adding extra blankets or investing in a pet bed that retains

If your pet's bed is near a door or window, check for draughts and consider moving their bed to a warmer, more insulated area of the

you have outdoor pets like rabbits or guinea pigs, ensure their housing is well-insulated and protected from the wind and rain. Consider bringing them inside on particularly cold nights.

Are there any specific health concerns for pets in October?

Just like humans, pets can suffer from seasonal allergies. If you notice your pet scratching more than usual or experiencing watery eyes or a runny nose, it might be due to autumn allergens.

Cooler weather can exacerbate joint pain, particularly in older pets or those with arthritis. If your pet seems stiff or has difficulty moving, speak to us about possible supplements or medications to ease their discomfort.

While ticks are often associated with the summer months, they can remain active well into autumn. Continue using tick prevention products and check your pet regularly, especially after walks in wooded or grassy areas.

Team effort restores vital bus links for local residents



VITAL bus links for Lymm residents are soon to be restored thanks to a team effort following a public meeting in the village last February.

Local residents travelling between Warrington, Sale and Altrincham will soon see big improvements to will soul see big improvements to their bus services, thanks to a team effort bringing together Warrington Borough Council, Transport for Greater Manchester, and local councillors.

Concerns had been raised when the Bee Network was introduced in Greater Manchester, as longstanding cross-boundary routes were affected. Lymm councillor Graham Gowland — also a director of Warrington's municipal bus company — called a public meeting where residents explained the impact these changes were having. Parish and ward councillors from the affected areas also attended, alongside officers from both councils.

As a result, services have now been improved, with better connections between Altrincham, Warrington and Sale, and the reinstatement of the full 280 route, which had previously been cut short because of a low bridge in

Cllr Graham Gowland said:
"This shows what can happen
when we listen to local people and
pull together to find solutions. It's
been a real team effort involving residents, councillors and officers, and it's fantastic to see a practical outcome that makes a real difference to daily lives." A follow-up meeting will be held

on Tuesday 30th September at Lymm Parish Hall, where residents can give further feedback and suggest improvements. Everyone is

Truckwash plans further growth after significant increase in turnover

It appears to have died out around the time of the first world war and was revived in 1972. Lymm is one of only a small number of places to maintain the tradition.
