I've done lots of things for children over the years with Kids Planet, but as my children are getting I'm recognising more that there's a real gap for young people in society.

Just last year, Clare took on the gruelling challenge of trekking across Cambodia for charity. This time, the charity trek will take place over five days in Jordan, starting next month.

Clare is expected to walk through

varying desert trails and sandstone canyons and commented, "These views will be stunning for sure, but I will not lose sight of the challenge at hand and why I am doing it." Kids Planet's head office team

has also been raising money for the charity. The central team, based in Lymm, headed out on a 5km walk along the countryside and canal to back their CEO.

Clare explains "I've seen the impact this charity can have on the women of our future. As a mum of three teenage girls, this is something very dear to my heart. These challenges have become something I look forward to year after year. I can't wait to see what November brings.



Causeway business centre from 8 am to 3 pm each working day.

"I'm sure many residents will be familiar with our branch in Stockton Heath, but now they can enjoy the convenience of us being on their doorstep," said Chris Shelmerdine. "It's a busy road with a very visible frontage onto Wilderspool Causeway so we're expecting plenty of passing

The company has signed a 10year lease on the unit, next door to St James's Church, and its opening is in line with the completion of the multimillion-pound refurbishment of the business centre and its rebranding as The Causeway. Funding for the refurbishment has been provided by the government's Town Deal programme and is focused on attracting the next generation of digital businesses to the development.

"We have carefully brought the business centre up to the very best modern standards, and so it was critical that we found a catering partner who could meet the needs of our tenants of our tenants as well as our neighbours," said Jayne Furnival of Langtree, which manages the site for Wire Regeneration, Langtree's joint

venture with Warrington Council.

"The new outlet allows us to open a frontage onto Wilderspool Causeway and helps reinforce the changes within the building," added Jayne. "The investment has already yielded considerable lettings success, with six new tenants moving in since work progressed. I expect that to pick up further once people realise they can get the best coffee in town."

The centre is adopting its new name to reflect the changes and improvements brought about by its multi-million pound refurbishment. It's old name – St James Business Centre - will be phased out in the coming months, with the public seeing new signage and tenants benefitting from a host of new internal features, such as refurbished public areas, space for start-ups and virtual tenants, super-fast broadband and wi-fienabled meeting rooms for hire.



Tributes following sudden death of former Parish Priest Father Michael

TRIBUTES were made following the sudden death of former Parish Priest Father Michael Burgess who sadly died shortly after announcing his retirement.

Ordained in 1973, he served as a curate in Beamish, then as a parish priest in two parishes in Cornwall. Between 1980-86 he was director of the South West Ministry Training Course. He became sub-warden at St Deiniol's Library in 1986 and was appointed to St Peter's Oughtrington in 1991. Two years later, a joint benefice with Warburton was

For over 30 years, Fr. Michael served as a trustee governor at Lymm High School and was chair of governors at Oughtrington Primary for many years. He had been assistant chaplain at Chester University and a member of Warrington SACRE. He was also chaplain to the local ATC and from 2002 was diocesan chaplain to the

Mothers' Union. In 2010, Fr Michael was made an Honorary Canon of Chester Cathedral.

Fr Michael was very active in community life, taking part in Dickensian day, May Queen and "Carols at the Cross" where he led the singing for many years. He was involved with the Lymm Festival from its inception, serving on the committee, giving talks, organising and taking part in concerts and poetry readings. He has steadfastly supported the ecumenical work of Churches Together in Lymm. Many will remember Fr. Michael as an accomplished musician and organist

who loved singing!
In recent years, St Peter's church
hall project was interrupted by the
pandemic and took far longer than anticipated, needing significant fund raising efforts owing to rising costs after Covid. The success of the hall project owes a great deal to Fr Michael's hard work in supporting the entire process. The new church hall stands complete at the corner of Stage Lane and will be a tremendous asset to the local community and a lasting memorial to his endeavours. As news of his sudden death cirulated around the village tributes

were made on social media.

Prostate Cancer - Why men need to start talking and testing

Prostate cancer is the most common cancer in men in the UK. Around one in eight men will develop it during their lifetime, but for those with a family history or higher-risk background such as Black African or Caribbean heritage—the risk rises to one in four.

Despite this, too many men still delay getting checked. Early detection remains the key to survival, yet many only present once symptoms appear, when once symptoms appear, when treatment options are more limited. Any man over 40, or with a family history, should feel confident in asking their GP for assessment and screening.

Initial assessment involves a thorough medical history and a simple blood test called PSA (Prostate Specific Antigen). While

PSA testing isn't perfect—it can be raised for benign reasons, and occasionally normal in men with cancer—it's still a vital first step. Examination of the prostate is no longer routinely required, as modern testing methods provide far

more insight.

The real diagnostic challenge lies in men with PSA levels between 2.5 and 10-the so-called "grey zone" This is where newer tests such as Stockholm3 are proving invaluable. Stockholm3 combines PSA with

additional biomarkers and genetic data to better identify which men need further investigation, helping avoid unnecessary MRI scans or biopsies.

At myGP Clinic, we believe in proactive medicine. In 2024, through our screening programmes, we detected prostate cancer in 14 men—all of whom were able to receive treatment with curative intent. These are lives that could

have been lost without early testing. As a GP—and as someone who lost my father to prostate cancer—I know first-hand how important it is to break the silence around men's health. Talk to your GP, get tested, and encourage others to do the

Award winning photographer opens "Lymm In Li

AWARD-winning photographer Alan Taylor was on hand to officially open the "Lymm In Living Memory" photography exhibition in the village where he covered numerous events during his long career.

While most people who owned a camera in post-war England from the 50s to the 1980s saved their expensive film for holidays and special occasions, Alan was in a group of aspiring young photographers in the village, unknown to each other at the time, out there recording scenes of daily village life. Most notable among these was Alan who would go on to become the award winning chief photographer for the Cheshire Guardian newspaper group. Now the first time many of these

photographs are going on display in a new show at Lymm Heritage Centre called "Lymm In Living Memory".

The pictures capture among other things the rise of the motor-car, the passing of the railway, post-war demolition and rebuilding, the daily trip to the shops, leisurely Sundays and village events.

Alongside the pictures are reminiscences from local people while a big-screen memory-map allows visitors to explore over a hundred locations round the village.

The exhibition is being staged in a new space at the Centre which is being used for the first time.

"It seemed fitting that this new exhibition area should be used to display the work of local photographers," Heritage Centre Chair, Alan Williams said. "Especially as it includes many of the outstanding photographs taken during the 50s and 60s by one of our most active supporters Alan Taylor. His contribution toward recording the history of Lymm has been so important and is clearly evident in

this exhibition. We were delighted that Alan was able to cut the ribbon for us to open not just the exhibition but the new gallery which will be a valuable resource for the Centre and the village.

"Whether your interest is photography, social history or just plain, simple nostalgia we think you will love this unique exhibition that captures the kind of changes that were happening in towns and villages all over the country."

Divorce Column

Surviving Christmas after Divorce

For many separated parents Christmas brings mixed emotions. What is traditionally regarded as a family-centred celebration can instead become a source of stress, uncertainty, conflict and possibly resentment. However, with a little planning and a focus on what is best for the children Christmas can still run smoothly.

The starting point is preparation. Clear arrangements agreed well in advance help avoid misunderstandings. If there is a child arrangements order in place then it is worth revisiting the wording to ensure that the terms are clearly understood, including where the children should be on specific days and how any handovers will work. Where no formal order exists, written confirmation by text or email of what has been agreed can help prevent misunderstandings and disputes.

Communication between parties should be kept brief, polite and respectful. Christmas is not the time to revisit historic grievances or raise new issues. Keeping discussions brief, polite and limited to essential information reduces the scope for conflict. Christmas naturally requires compromise and children cope best when both parents remain calm, flexible and work together. They should not feel caught between warring households or worried about upsetting either parent.

Financial pressure can also be a concern, particularly when budgets are stretched across two homes. There is no requirement to match spending or compete over presents and any temptation to do so should be resisted. Whilst children will naturally be excited to receive presents they will also value time, attention, stability and

Despite best efforts conflict may unfortunately arise. If you are concerned that arrangements may not be followed then early legal advice can be helpful. Whilst urgent legal remedies are available if necessary court proceedings should remain a last resort and where possible mediation or solicitor-assisted negotiation may offer a faster and more cost-effective solution.

Christmas after a separation is bound to feel different but that does not mean it cannot be positive. With clear arrangements, a calm approach and a focus on the children's wellbeing families can create new traditions and new happy memories.

IT was a rewarding night for Lymm Runners as they scooped two volunteer awards at Leigh Sports Stadium!

The Club came away with two awards from the England Athletics NW Regional Volunteer Awards 2025, achieving 3rd Place Club of the Year and a terrific Runner Up for Community Event of the Year.

The prizewinning Community Event was the 48 Mile Goggins Ultra Marathon: a weekend of 12 runs of 48 miles over 48 hours initiated by Lymm Runner Rich Waggit, which raised over £18,000 for the Walton Centre in Liverpool. It was the biggest fundraising event the Club had ever done and involved around 100 runners and a huge support crew

of club members plus their friends and families.

For the Podium place for Club of the Year, England Athletics commented that the Club 'exemplifies community spirit through an all-year-round commitment to local causes.'

Responding to these comments, Chris Lees, Chair of Lymm Runners said: "I am delighted that Lymm Runners has been recognised for the club's impact within the community and the hard work and commitment by its members and volunteers. Though the Goggins event in the Spring was rightly commended, it

was just one example of the club's deep commitment to our community. We were the only road running club recognised in The Club of the Year Award, identifying the inclusive and safe environment for all standards of runners and power walkers. A tribute to the welcoming ethos from all members.
