THE ongoing financial issues at Warrington town hall seem to be coming to a head with the forthcoming budget, with cuts left, right and centre.

At time of writing, much of what is proposed in the budget is dependant on whether the borough council will get additional financial support from the Government.

Permission has already been given to increase council tax by up to 7.5 per cent, but this will only scratch the black hole in the £130m funding gap over the next four years.

While council tax is probably increasing by 7.5pc along with the controlling Labour group councillors also voting to increase their allowances, our services are going to be reduced and jobs are going to go.

The council has been warned for

many years about risky investments to plug funding shortfalls.

Instead of cutting their cloth accordingly, the council has gambled and sadly failed in a big way – and no one has been found liable and no apology been given.

Meanwhile the Government envoys, sent in to balance the books, appear to be taking no prisoners as they prepare to sell-off Birchwood Park and Redwood Bank, while also reviewing Times Square.

With other proposed cut backs including the likes of a creche at Orford Park Jubilee Hub, to save just £33k a year, prepare for lots more cut backs!

Tough times are ahead, so fasten

your seat belts for the roller coaster journey ahead!

To finish on a positive note Warrington Wolves kicked off the new season in front of a record-breaking sell-out crowd of over 15,000 against St Helens at the Halliwell Jones Stadium and produced a thrilling 24-14 victory.

As the club celebrates 150 years and I celebrate 50 years of following the Wire, we need it to be "Our Year" more than ever to give Warrington something to shout about!

And yes, I do know I appeared on the Sky Sports TV screens more than Luke Littler on the night!!

Born in 1943 and teaching since 1966, Ron has now dedicated 60 years to helping the people of Warrington learn to drive, and he's still going strong.

Over the decades, Ron has taught more than 8,000 people. He's taught parents, their children, their grandchildren, and now even their great-grandchildren. That's not just experience; that's a legacy.

Ron describes himself as "semi-retired," but he simply can't keep away from the job he loves. He still comes out during the week for lessons because he enjoys meeting people and being part of their journey. In fact, he says he can't go anywhere in Warrington without meeting someone he has taught!

From doctors and solicitors to bin men and police officers, Ron has taught people from every profession and every walk of life. His impact reaches across the whole community.

Paying tribute, Mayor Hussain said: "Ron must surely be one of, if not the longest-serving, driving instructors in the country. Sixty years in any profession is remarkable, but sixty years shaping the confidence and independence of thousands of people is truly extraordinary.

"Many may also remember that Ron once played in a band called

"Ron Pickard's Sounds." Sadly, the band folded after the other members passed away, and Ron is now the only surviving member, a




Charity trustee completes gruelling Cuba jungle trek in memory of mum

Warrington Visually Impaired People (VIP) charity Trustee, Lisa Sperrin, has completed a demanding multi-day jungle trek across Cuba, raising vital funds for the charity in memory of her mum, Anna, who sadly passed away last year.

Lisa took on the challenge alongside her sister, Doris, pushing themselves through steep mountain terrain, tropical heat, heavy rain, mist, and remote jungle conditions, all in support of a charity that had been a lifeline to their mum for many years.

The journey began on 23 January with a light-hearted start at customs, when a security officer unpacked Lisa's carefully organised backpack, pulling out a bra first, much to everyone's amusement. "It took me hours to pack that bag," Lisa joked, "and that's the first thing he pulls out!" Determined and in good spirits, the sisters continued their journey to Heathrow, even improvising transport when airport pods broke down.

After arriving safely in Cuba on 26 January, Lisa shared daily updates with supporters back home. The group acclimatised in Havana before travelling deep into the jungle near Hanabanilla, where the real challenge began. Highlights included visits to coffee

and sugar cane plantations, lunch at Las Palmas Ranch, and trekking through tropical fruit farms, alongside less glamorous realities such as cold showers, power cuts, and no internet. Eat your heart out I'm a Celebrity... Get Me Out of Here!, as the sisters swapped luxury for jungle camps, muddy trails, and plenty of aching muscles.

Describing the experience, Lisa said: "This has to be the hardest thing I've ever done. It made Ben Nevis seem easy! The weather was rainy and misty, we were camping in the jungle, and my legs were burning, but the people, the place, and the whole experience were absolutely amazing. I don't know why I agree to these things, but I'm so glad I did!"

The trek took the sisters and their fellow walkers past stunning waterfalls such as Vegas Grande, through rugged jungle terrain, and all the way to the historic city of Trinidad, where the group celebrated completing the challenge together.

Lisa, who became a trustee of Warrington VIP in 2025, said: "My sister and I took on this challenging trek across Cuba, no small feat in the Caribbean heat! I am incredibly proud to be raising funds in memory of our mum for Warrington VIP, an organisation that was her lifeline. She had been part of the charity for many years, and the support and friendships she found there meant the world to her. Before Mum passed, she told us to look after each other, stick together, and live life before it's too late. Those words inspired me to take on this

ultimate trek, pushing myself while supporting a cause so close to our hearts. Thank you so much for your support."

Chair of Trustees Geoff Settle praised Lisa's efforts, saying: "A new member of the VIP board and already making a great contribution to VIP."

Throughout the trek, Lisa kept supporters updated with humour and honesty, from jungle camping and aching muscles to joining locals to cool off after long days of walking, and continued to encourage donations right up until the final day.

The fundraiser concluded with celebrations in Trinidad and a return to Havana, marking the

successful end of an unforgettable journey.

So far the fundraiser has raised £573 plus £108.75 in gift aid. Warrington VIP extends thanks to everyone who supported Lisa and her sister through donations, encouragement, and messages of goodwill. Funds raised will go directly towards improving services and opportunities for people with visual impairments in the Warrington area.

New dentist joins the team



Introduction

Chair and Chief Executive's Report

Welcome to our latest annual report.

Throughout the past year, we listened, learned and respond to thousands of enquiries we received from disabled and older people, carers and families. Our team used their skills and expertise to find solutions to everyday challenges, and when we couldn't, we ensured a smooth handover to one of our trusted partners who could. We continued to share insights gained from disabled peoples lived experiences with policy makers and service providers.

"Hot" is the word that best describes our 34th annual Disability Awareness Day. Sixteen partners provided the financial support, enabling us to run a week of events that, along with our main show, attracted over 20,000 visitors and involved over 1,200 volunteers.

Our inclusive Santa's Grotto and Winter Wonderland in Walton Gardens attracted over 3,000 children and nearly 10,000 family members. With financial support from local businesses and individuals we distributed over 500 free tickets to disadvantaged children, and our annual Santa Dash attracted nearly 200 participants.

We used our status as a Disability Confident Leader to deliver a range of Disability Awareness and Reasonable Adjustment training sessions that were attended by over 600 people.

With funding we secured from Warrington Borough Council's allocation of the UK Shared Prosperity Fund, we offered free access and facilities audits to businesses and community organisations. The 80 disability access audit reports and recommendations we completed, together with over 200 free portable ramps, induction loop systems, handrails and signage, have enhanced accessibility for thousands of local disabled residents.

Our social enterprise, the Disability Trading Company continues to grow in popularity, attracting interest from new suppliers, and being invited to influence the design of several independent living products. Being recognised nationally as a Large Motability Dealer was one of the many highlights for our team. In response to feedback from disabled people about the damaging effects of the cost-of-living crisis we increased availability of refurbished equipment under the banner of Loved B4 Mobility through our store in Warrington Town Centre.

As we look ahead, we know that funding will be tougher than ever before. With Warrington Borough Council and local NHS commissioning teams planning huge multi-million-pound cuts, both internally and externally. The results will no doubt see contracts and grants to several of our core services withdrawn and this will inevitably leave vulnerable people at risk. Whilst appreciating that the year ahead will be

difficult, we aim to focus on maintaining our core purpose of improving the lives of people affected by disability and long-term health conditions.

One glimmer of light will be the launching of our new wide-beam canal boat, the Wizard II – John B which has been designed and built with accessibility in mind. Funding was made possible from a bequest from a lady who contacted our services to discuss her dream of buying an accessible narrowboat in honour of her late husband. This underlines the importance of one of our key values, that of listening and responding to feedback.

During the past year, we sadly lost three members of our WDP family. Our thoughts go out to the families and friends of Mark Stevenson, Terry Wadsworth and Pat Maclaren. May they all rest in peace.

Finally, we would like to thank everyone who shares and supports the WDP dream, especially our volunteers, our trustees, our staff, our supporters, our clients/customers and our partners.

Who we are and what we do

Warrington Disability Partnership (WDP) is an internationally acclaimed user-led charity. With over 30 years of experience in developing and delivering mobility and independent living services, we aim to support disabled people and those living with long-term health conditions. We are proud of our wide-ranging services, which include:

Promoting Independent Living

Visit our **Centre for Independent Living (CIL)** - located on Beaufort Street; the **Disabled Living Centre** at the Lifehouse on Brunswick Dock; and the **Mobility and Independent Living Stores (MILs)** in Birchwood Shopping Centre and Golden Square Shopping Centre. We offer showrooms full of the latest equipment from baths, showers and kitchens to beds, wheelchairs and stair lifts. Advice is available from our team of trained staff and volunteers, and we also have a short-term hires service for various equipment.

The **Energy Support Service** provides help and support to households falling into fuel poverty. The fully qualified advisors will give 1-2-1 advice along with home visits and referrals to wider services. We also have a fully accessible **"Energy Efficient Smart Flat"** demonstrating the latest assistive technology solutions, based at the CIL. Our popular **Disability Helpline (01925 240064)** offers advice and support about local support groups and services, accessibility, transport, and more.

Our two **Shopmobility Schemes** in Legh Street Car Park and Birchwood Shopping Centre offer scooters and wheelchairs for use while shopping. They are available for hire to both members and day visitors, Monday to Saturday (9 am to 5 pm). A six-month membership costs just £10. The **Scoota Safe** campaign helps promote safe use of personal equipment, advice on maintenance and raises awareness of road safety.

The **OWCH Pain Management and Beyond the Scars support group** helps and supports local disabled people with self-management of Chronic Pain.

Our **Long Covid Support Group** meets every other Friday and online. The group supports all those who are dealing with the symptoms of Long Covid.

Our **Independent Living Team** provides a support service for Warrington residents who use the Direct Payments scheme from Warrington Borough Council, assisting with all aspects of employing a Personal Assistant including assistance and advice regarding recruitment, DBS checks, pension schemes and contracts, with support from our in-house payroll team.

Our Care and Support Advisor promotes **Personal Health Budgets (PHBs)** for individuals with complex health needs throughout Warrington and Halton. PHBs aim to allow greater choice, flexibility and control over how and when NHS-funded care is delivered. The Advisor works with the clients to produce individual Care and Support Plans, liaising with the NHS Cheshire & Merseyside concerning individual budget allocations.

The Disability Trading Company Limited

WDP's trading arm – Disability Trading Company (DTC), offers high-quality, independent living products at competitive prices. Running as a Social Enterprise, all profits are donated to WDP to support many of our unfunded services. For further details of services, please see page 6.

Employment & Training

Our **Employment Team** specialises in supporting local disabled people, people living with long-term health conditions (including mental health), ESA claimants and

those in receipt of incapacity-related benefits. The team support individuals through all stages of the employment process, job searching, CVs, application forms, preparing for interviews and when gaining employment. We also support people who are in work, as well as employers, by giving information about reasonable adjustments in the workplace including the Access to Work Scheme, the Disability Confident Scheme. We are a Mindful Employer.

Learning and Development

Visit the **Marjorie Griffiths Learning Centre** on Beaufort Street and take advantage of a whole host of courses designed to educate and inspire. Many courses are held in the Discover IT Suite and include 'Computers for the Terrified', vocational OCR qualifications and pre-employment IT. In addition, several other courses are available, which include flower arranging and creative writing.

We work closely with numerous local charities and voluntary organisations to provide a place for groups to meet and offer support to their members. Our well-equipped meeting and training rooms are also available to hire at a reasonable cost.

WDP delivers a variety of training, including **Equality & Diversity, Disability Confident, Neurodiversity and Disability, and Sex Matters**. Half-day training sessions are available to service providers, voluntary organisations and individuals to build knowledge and insight on these issues.

Accessible Holidays & Days Out

Our fully accessible caravan in North Wales is available for hire at competitive rates as will our adapted, accessible narrowboat **The Wizard II - John B** will later this year. With a range of options, they allow a bargain break or a day out on the water!

Opportunities to Socialise

We run two **Luncheon Clubs** for individuals looking for friendship, activities, fun and lunch! Our **over 55's club** meet every Wednesday from 10am to 2pm. As well as enjoying a two-course lunch and drinks, attendees also enjoy playing bingo, games, quizzes, chair-based exercises, and guest speakers. Our **Monday Club** caters to under 55's with a variety of social activities, including crafts, bingo and films. There is a £7.50 charge for the sessions and individuals are required to attend using their own transport.

Our **Galleries Community Café** offers a wide range of hot and cold meals, snacks and drinks in a warm and friendly atmosphere. The Café is open to members of the public, visitors to the Centre and Support Groups.

Listening and Advocacy

Get your voice heard locally by attending our monthly **'Staying Connected'** meetings via Zoom, which provides a forum to exchange ideas and information about local services. Sessions are open to all who have been affected by long-term health conditions or disabilities, carers and representatives of support groups/organisations and statutory services.

We organise the **Warrington's Appreciation of Efforts Awards**, which provide an opportunity for disabled people and carers to nominate local employers, businesses, service providers or individuals who deserve recognition for promoting independence, delivering accessible or inclusive services or maintaining exemplary employment practices for disabled people and carers.

Development of Warrington Disability Partnership's Social Enterprise – The Disability Trading Company

In April 2011, Warrington Disability Partnership launched a social enterprise 'The Disability Trading Company'. Their first retail service was launched from the Warrington Centre for Independent Living, and in October 2011 they opened the Mobility & Independent Living Store (MILS) in the Golden Square Shopping Mall, followed by MILS Liverpool in early 2012.

In early 2013 DTC opened a large Mobility Workshop & Service Centre which provides servicing and repairs for individual customers, and businesses including Warrington and Halton Teaching Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust, nursing homes and local Shopmobility Schemes. In late 2013 DTC launched a service aimed at recycling mobility equipment, scooters, wheelchairs and power-chairs.

Second-hand products are refurbished and recycled to be sold at a low cost to local people from our Golden Square shop. In partnership with other organisations, such as Care UK, products that are unable to be sold are donated to help disabled people in other countries. To-date, over £1 million worth of equipment has been donated to support disabled people across the world; including in Thailand, Egypt, Cameroon, Syria, Ukraine and Greece.

In 2017 DTC joined the British Health Trades Association, underlining their belief in the BHTA "Buy with Confidence" scheme that is accredited to Trading Standards. Receiving "approved dealer" accreditation to the national Motability Scheme was also achieved, which allows disabled people to use the enhanced mobility component of DLA or PIP to lease a powerchair or mobility scooter.

In 2018 DTC opened a new service, the Smart Flat is an assistive technology showroom located at the Warrington Centre for Independent living.

In 2019 in partnership with the Golden Square Shopping Centre, DTC moved their Mobility & Independent Living Store (MILS) from inside the Centre to a larger brighter store in Sankey Street.

In 2020 in partnership with Birchwood Shopping Centre, DTC opened a Mobility and Independent Living Store (MILS) in the Centre, it also includes Birchwood Shopmobility Service.

In 2022, DTC launched a new online shop designed so customers across the UK can purchase high-quality mobility & independent living products from the comfort of their homes. All our products can help increase your ability to live independently. We pride ourselves on a fast delivery service, and promise to pick up and send you your order before the end of the next working day. What makes DTC unique?

- DTC has no private shareholders, 100% of its profits go to support WDP's charitable services which include subsidised Lunch Clubs for disabled people, an accessible narrowboat offering daytrips on the Bridgewater Canal and an accessible caravan in North Wales,
- DTC staff do not receive any incentive bonuses, which results in us providing advice versus high pressure selling,
- Free impartial home and work assessments based on the philosophy of information, advice and guidance, not just sales,
- DTC is a user-led social enterprise; many staff and all volunteers have used their experience of living with a disability or long-term health condition to develop the services and ensure they sell the right products
- Nearly £2.5million has been saved by disabled people who have purchased mobility and independent living products from WDP's Mobility and Independent Living Stores (MILS) rather than from commercially driven businesses

Louise James - Case Study

I started working at WDP in October 2025, I had lost my job in June 2024 due to menopause symptoms, and I thought no-one would want to hire me.

I started seeing Lorraine with the employment team at WDP not long after, and boy did she have her work cut out for her!! I used to sit at her desk feeling so sorry for myself and mainly crying, she was amazingly patient with me and helped to build my confidence back up, she (very kindly) made me appointments when all I wanted to do was stay in bed. After some time she called me to say I have the perfect job for you and did I want to apply, I did! And she was right, this is perfect! Lorraine was my angel in all of this!

My role at WDP is to help people find a personal assistant for people living with disabilities, I get to go out into the community and meet people with all kinds of disabilities, some visible some not, and help them with the paperwork to help to enable them to stay in their own homes. I finally feel happy and content and the best thing is the people we help. The second-best thing is the people here at Warrington Disability Partnership, they are lovely to work alongside with.

I also got involved with the Grotto at Christmas, pure joy!! I worked as an elf with Santa and just seeing the children's faces, it sounds corny but it really was the highlight of my year.

Even though I came here to see Lorraine I did not know about all WDP does, I did two flower arranging courses here and loved it! There is always something going on, the first time I saw the smart flat I was blown away!! If you haven't seen it yet you need too!!

My home life is a little chaotic at the moment as I have an eight-month-old Jack Russell pup called, wait for it, Russell! I'm doing a lot of walking with him whatever the weather and in my downtime, I love to read, and I read anything! My prized possession is my kindle; it goes everywhere with me just in case I get a moment.

Personal Development - Ellen Houghton

Ellen started volunteering at WDP when she was 12 years old within the main office. She would help with administration, answering phone calls and help with fundraising events on the weekend. At the age of 15 Ellen was diagnosed with stage 4 cancer and was hospitalised for 2 years, throughout her time in hospital she kept contact with team members and would visit occasionally, WDP donated to Ellen's cause to fund her dream trip to America.

After receiving all clear, she continued voluntary work with the charity and even becoming a co-opted young trustee and after college became an apprentice studying Level 3 Business Administration while also promoting covid vaccines as a community champion. After working in a junior administrator's role, she completed her apprenticeship successfully and became a full-time staff member working within the energy team as administrator completing and passing her exams. Whilst being fully qualified she then moved up took the place of advisor within the team whilst still completing the team's administration. Due to gaps within the office from members leaving, she stepped up and took on more responsibility and gaining new skills learning leadership coordinating our in house HAF programme alongside Caroline. Ellen also found herself looking after more duties within the team and eventually becoming Energy Efficiency Team Leader.

Thanks to WDP they gave me a good start in life enabling me to gain the skills, confidence and qualifications needed to be the person i am today.

Mr and Mrs J - Customer Testimonial

Mr and Mrs J were a retired couple struggling to live off their pensions, they had worked all their lives with Mr J working within the army. During their working lives they had acquired long term health conditions and multiple disabilities. Mrs J reached out to Warrington Disability Partnership in the hope of seeking advice and help.

They had a lot of additional costs for daily living aids, which were helping them to be more independent within their home. Their advisor visited their home and after a short conversation it was apparent they could both claim Attendance Allowance.

After completing the forms with the couple and waiting for a result, we had the successful news that they had both been awarded Attendance allowance at full rate for Mrs J and low rate for Mr J and were very emotional. They now feel less anxious and can live a lot more comfortably with heat in their home and food on the table, with the increased income. Mrs J said “Thank you so much to WDP, you have changed our lives forever”.

Disability Awareness Day 2025 (DAD34)

In complete contrast to the showers in 2024, One word best described Disability Awareness Day 2025 “HOT”. Over 20,000 people visited the 34th Annual event at Walton Hall & Gardens.

The aim of our flagship event, widely known as the world's largest voluntary led pan disability exhibition was to promote independent living through the theme “It's what disabled people can do that matters” and was the culmination of a week-long of activities raising awareness about disability.

Local disability education specialists Expanse Learning Group and the north west's water supplier United Utilities, led the list of sponsors for DAD 2025. The event highlighted solutions supporting independent living and mobility, with equipment, products, transport, employment, education, training, health and social care, leisure activities, alongside over 100 charities/support groups. During the day we were also honored by the presence of three local dignities, the Lord Lieutenant of Cheshire, the High Sheriff of Cheshire and the Mayor of Warrington.

Most of this year's Disability Awareness Day exhibitors were housed in a huge, tented village of marquees, supported by; an extended Sports Zone, a Main Arena, a huge Performing Arts Marquee, three further Arts Marquees for art and crafts

(including regular workshops), a Silent Disco, a children's fun fair and play areas.

With over 200 exhibitors, visitors could gain an insight into the help and support that is available locally, regionally and nationally from statutory organisations, businesses and voluntary sector groups, as well as trying new and adaptive activities including Tennis, Snooker, Rugby League, Martial Arts, Tai Chi, Football, Scuba Diving in the on-site pool and Warrington Youth Zone's giant sports inflatables.

For those looking for a more relaxed day a fantastic line-up of talent could be found in the Arts Marquee with performances from some of the UK's leading disabled artists including Ella Performance Group, Creating Adventures, Wargrave Community Choir, Carly Ryan and Groovy Movers. BSL interpreters supported all acts.

Alternatively, the Main Arena hosted a variety of lively acts including the Guide Dog display team, Reach Sled Dogs Display Team, Batida Rio Samba Band, Royal Marines Corps of Drums and sports demonstrations.

Support services at DAD 2025 included a free accessible Park and Ride service, free accessible buses from Warrington Town Centre courtesy of Warrington's Own Buses, a free mobility scooter and wheelchair loan service (subject to availability), British Sign Language interpreters, additional unisex wheelchair accessible toilets and over 60 trained stewards and helper's eager to make it a day to remember for everyone

The DAD site team were joined during the week by over seventy volunteers from EE, nine from Terry Lifts, six from Handelsbanken and 10 from Thorn Cross prison who all helped to set up the site in preparation for the event.

It was a fantastic way to start our 2025 grotto. The gratitude that our visitors showed was humbling and hearing the stories from some of the families underlined why this was so important.




What makes our Grotto unique?

Warrington Disability Partnership have over 20 years' experience of running a fully inclusive Santa's Grotto, which can be visited by all.
- WDP's Santa and some of our elves can communicate with deaf children and parents through British Sign Language.
- After listening to parents, WDP have included Quiet Hours, where the individual needs of children, parents and grandparents can be met, including Autism, Dementia and Alzheimer's.
- The Quiet Hour also caters for people who have sight loss, with trained sighted guides offering guided tours and interactive experience including touching, feeling and smelling a Christmas tree and other display items, within the sensory area.


WDP Financial Position 2024-25




The Team completed 80 disability access audit reports for local Warrington businesses, providing over 200 free portable ramps, induction loop systems, handrails and signage.

Legacy Donation – Wizard II - John B

After 18 years which saw a total refurbishment and numerous major repairs, Warrington Disability Partnership's Wizard accessible narrowboat was finally retired due to it being unfit to continue in service.

During those 18 years over 20,000 passengers, many were wheelchair users, had a wonderful, relaxing day trip on the scenic Bridgewater Canal, thanks to our amazing team of volunteers.

However, after an amazing donation from a wonderful lady, who wanted to leave a charitable legacy, specifically for an accessible boat in memory of her husband, the "Wizard II - John B" will be launched in time for 2026 season.

"Wizard II - John B" is currently under construction and has been designed to be fully accessible, not retrofitted like our original Wizard. It won't simply be accessible, this can be driven by wheelchair users, the accessible toilet will be full size and the lift is a proper wheelchair lift, built specifically for this boat.

"Wizard II - John B" will be bigger, 10ft 6ins wide and 50ft long compared to 6ft 6ins wide and 37ft long. She will have full central heating, independent lighting, a quiet engine, a galley kitchen and detachable windows to allow passengers to get

closer to the water and breathe in the fresh air.

Massive Wagons top the bill of high-energy rock 'n' roll at Parr Hall

AS I left Warrington's historic Parr Hall still buzzing after possibly the most high-energy rock 'n' roll gig I've ever witnessed, I was left wondering why Massive Wagons had never really been on my radar before?

I'd seen them a few years back as a support band to Lynyrd Skynyrd, but missed out on their last sell-out gig at the Parr Hall last year.

I checked their music out a couple of weeks ahead of this gig, and liked the sound of what I was hearing.

Now I think it is fair to say I have become a massive fan.

The energy levels of lead vocalist Barry Mills is like nothing I have seen before – maybe Angus Young in his younger years?

As a veteran of rock gigs of more than half a century and having seen the likes of Status Quo, UFO, Michael Schenker, Magnum, Blackstar Sailor and The Stranglers grace the Parr Hall stage, this one topped the lot.

The quality of the music, the energy of the performers, the intimacy of the venue and the support of men's mental health, supporting Andy's Man's Club, it had everything – including four t-shirts for as little as £10!! (Yes, I've got one!!)

While I recognised a handful of the songs that rolled out over one hour and 40 minutes, I think it's fair to say I enjoyed every single song. When the guys came back

for the encore, just wearing their underpants, I did start to wonder – but when Barry told the crowd "you have to do what the Mrs says to support mental health," I understood exactly where he was coming from.

The band clearly enjoyed the intimacy of the Parr Hall, with Barry, entering the crowd for a full five minutes during the encore, singing along and embracing fans-moments which will live long in the memory of those in the audience.

Based on this performance, I believe Massive Wagons are set to become "massive," filling the void left by the veteran rockers from 50 years ago, who have already ended their journey, or are set to do so in the next few years as Father Time catches up with them all.

I truly hope Massive Wagons can make another triumphant return to the Parr Hall, but I fear they might outgrow the 1,300 capacity venue.

But having said that, I don't think these guys do it just for the money, so fingers crossed, the historic Parr Hall might just lure them back at least one more time! Fingers crossed!

According to Wikipedia, the band formed in Lancaster came

together after guitarist Adam Thistlethwaite and vocalist Barry Mills broke away from their popular indie cover band Ace Face, after witnessing a gig by the Australian rock band Airbourne in Manchester, to write original hard rock music in 2009. Following a short period with another drummer and bass guitarist, the eventual line-up was secured by recruiting Alex Thistlethwaite (brother of Adam) on drums and friends Carl Cochrane and Adam Bouskill on second guitar and bass respectively. In 2017, Carl Cochrane departed and Stephen Holl joined the band

as second guitarist; this remains the only line-up change to date.

Next up for me is Airbourne in Manchester next month – a band I suspect might even match the energy of Massive Wagons, although I doubt anyone will ever headbang and pogo as much as front man Barry!

Finally a quick shout out to support band Scarlet Rebels – a four-piece rock band. I didn't manage to see the full set but from what I did see they had a good sound and went down well with the audience – and were certainly the perfect warm up act.

Not happy with the decision - Can I appeal?

Family court decisions can be life-changing. Whether they relate to children, finances or other family matters, it's understandable that people sometimes leave court feeling the outcome is unfair or wrong. But can a decision be appealed?

The short answer is maybe. It depends. There is no automatic right to appeal. Appealing a family court decision is not about simply disagreeing with the Judge. In almost every case there's usually at least one party who disagrees with the Judge. Appeals are tightly controlled and are only allowed where there is a proper legal basis.

The appeal court will not re-hear the case or reconsider the evidence just because one party is unhappy with the result. Instead, an appeal must be based on an error of law, a serious procedural irregularity, or a decision that falls outside the range of reasonable outcomes open to the Judge.

Timing is also critical. In most family cases an appeal must be started within 21 days of the decision being appealed. In some circumstances a shorter period may apply. In many situations, permission to appeal is required — either from the Judge who made the original decision or from the appeal court itself. This initial stage acts as a filter to ensure that only appeals with real merit proceed.

It is also important to consider the practical and emotional costs. Appeals can be expensive, stressful and time-consuming. In cases involving children, the court will be particularly concerned about delay and the impact further proceedings may have on them.

For these reasons, taking early advice is essential. Appealing a decision is not a step to be taken lightly. An experienced family law solicitor will be able to assess whether there are genuine grounds to appeal, explain the risks and prospects of success, and help you decide whether an appeal is the right step to take.

Swim England backs Bid to Save Woolston Hub

SWIM England, the National Governing Body for swimming in England, has sent two reports to Warrington Borough Council in support of retaining Woolston Neighbourhood Hub.

They have dismissed the thinking that Warrington has a sufficient amount of water space available for public swimming.

Nationally, Swim England recommends a total of 12 square metres per 1000 population, based on a country-wide average. This means that Warrington should have just over 2500 square metres - increasing with the new houses due to be built in the near future.

However, including Woolston Neighbourhood Hub, and including two non-Livewire Community pools at Penketh and Lymm, Warrington only has a mere 2040 square metres - one large pool and one small pool away from the recommended figure.

Judy Brown, Co-chair of the Save Woolston Hub Campaign, commented: "The reports that Swim England have submitted to Warrington Borough Council are extremely important.

Warrington has more than its fair share of rivers and waterways, and is within an hour's drive of several coastal locations. It also has a strong sporting culture where swimming and rowing have always featured highly.

"We should be well above the National average !! However, even if Woolston is reopened, we

still need another Centre the size of Orford Jubilee to just about scramble over the average figure for now. The recent small pool closure at Orford underlines even further why Warrington simply cannot get away with such a small amount of pool space for such a large amount of people. There will soon be a new generation of Warringtonians who don't have basic swimming skills, leaving them at greater risk around water, and shutting off a whole range of water-based sporting activities that they might otherwise have participated in.

"The reports also cited that in 2022, swimming saved the National economy over £2.4 billion pounds (over £4.4 million per constituency), so quite apart from all the negative effects on Health and wellbeing, and all the misery this closure is causing, the maths of closure simply don't add up!"

Healthspan in 2026: What actually adds years to your life?

We often talk about lifespan – how long we live. The more important question is healthspan – how long we remain well, independent and mentally sharp.

In Warrington, average life expectancy is around 79 years for men and 82 for women, broadly in line with national figures. However, healthy life expectancy – the years lived without significant illness or disability – is notably lower. Many people are living longer, but spending more of those later years coping with chronic disease.

The principal drivers are well established: cardiovascular disease, cancer, type 2 diabetes and cognitive decline. These conditions do not appear overnight. They develop quietly over decades before symptoms emerge, often signalled only by gradual changes in blood pressure, cholesterol or glucose levels.

The encouraging truth is that much of this risk is measurable and modifiable – both across communities and at an individual level.

Muscle mass is one of the strongest predictors of healthy ageing. From our forties onwards, we naturally lose muscle unless we actively maintain it. Reduced muscle is linked to frailty, insulin resistance and loss of independence. Two to three sessions of resistance training

per week – alongside regular walking or aerobic activity – is not about appearance; it is about preserving strength, metabolic resilience and functional capacity into later life.

Metabolic health sits at the centre of disease prevention. Waist circumference, blood pressure, fasting glucose and cholesterol provide early warning of future cardiovascular risk. Improving these markers is rarely complicated: consistent physical activity, prioritising whole foods over ultra-processed options, moderating refined carbohydrates, maintaining adequate protein intake and sustaining a healthy body composition all improve insulin sensitivity and reduce inflammation. Even modest weight reduction can significantly lower blood pressure and improve glucose control.

Substance use remains a major determinant of healthspan. Smoking is still the leading preventable cause of premature death in the UK. Alcohol increases cancer risk even at relatively low levels, and recreational drugs carry both immediate and longer-term cardiovascular and mental health

consequences.

Sleep and stress are frequently underestimated. Chronic sleep deprivation disrupts metabolic regulation, raises blood pressure and drives inflammation. Persistent stress produces similar physiological effects through sustained cortisol elevation. Seven to eight hours of consistent, restorative sleep – alongside practical stress management – is protective.

Social connection and emotional wellbeing also matter. Strong relationships, community involvement and a sense of purpose are consistently linked with lower mortality and better mental health. Isolation and chronic emotional

strain carry measurable health risks.

Importantly, these habits begin early. Children who grow up active, eating well, emotionally supported and socially connected are more likely to carry those patterns into adulthood. Preventive health starts in childhood.

That said, it is never too late to change course. The body retains remarkable capacity to respond to improved nutrition, increased activity and smoking cessation, even later in life.

Longevity is not simply about adding years. It is about ensuring those years remain active, independent and purposeful.

Birchwood Park marks 80 years at the heart of the UK's nuclear story

BIRCHWOOD Park in Warrington is marking a significant milestone this year, celebrating 80 years since the first meeting of the UK's atomic energy programme took place at the Risley site in a disused canteen.

That meeting, held on 4 February 1946 and led by Sir Christopher Hinton, later Lord, established the area as a focal point for nuclear coordination, design and innovation, bringing together an initial team of just 12 people tasked with designing, coordinating and delivering the UK's atomic energy programme.

From that moment, Risley became the design authority and heart of the nation's emerging nuclear infrastructure.

Today, it brings together over 6,000 nuclear specialists from more than 30 organisations in one dedicated nuclear cluster, uniquely supporting activity across the entire nuclear lifecycle. From research and design through to operations, decommissioning and waste management, it is the

highest concentration of nuclear employment in the UK.

This enduring role and celebration comes at a time of renewed momentum for nuclear.

The North West remains the UK's leading nuclear region, with the sector forecast to grow by more than 8% annually and employment expected to increase by almost 50% by 2030, according to new figures highlighted by the Northern Nuclear Alliance in its Nuclear Week in Parliament 2026 paper.

From post-war reactor design to modern clean energy technologies, Birchwood Park's story reflects the evolution of the UK's nuclear industry itself – combining long-standing engineering excellence with collaboration and innovation that continue to shape the sector's future.

Martin O'Rourke, Commercial Director at Birchwood Park, said: "This anniversary is a reminder that Birchwood Park has never been a peripheral site in the UK's nuclear story – it has been central to it for eight decades.

"For many people, that story is personal – with second and third generations of families building their careers here. As the sector looks ahead, that continuity of

skills and experience remains just as important as the innovation shaping the future.

"With increased investment and demand for nuclear skills, our focus is on ensuring Birchwood Park, in partnership with the Northern Nuclear Alliance (NNA), continues to enable collaboration, innovation and long-term growth – not just for the North West, but for the UK's energy future."

The North West is home to the UK's most comprehensive

nuclear ecosystem, including the Northern Nuclear Alliance, Amentum, Cavendish Nuclear, Rolls-Royce, The UK National Nuclear Laboratory and a globally recognised nuclear supply chain.

Together, the region hosts almost 50% of the UK's nuclear research and innovation activity, reinforcing its position as a cornerstone of the country's nuclear ambitions.

Spotlight on Local History with James Balme

A Visit to the ancient manor of the Mainwarings of Over Peover



Warrington is a town steeped in history dating back to the earliest times. Indeed, throughout the centuries members of the Mainwaring family were prominent landowners across Cheshire including owning land in Warrington.

But travel just thirty minutes to the south east of Warrington and you will find yourself in Over Peover once the manor held from the 13th century by the Mainwaring family who were lords of the estate.

Peover Hall that we see today was first built in 1585 by Sir Randle Mainwaring. This beautiful Elizabethan house remained the ancestral home to the Mainwarings for almost 340 years before it was sold to a private buyer in 1919. Today the hall is a family home but is open to the public on selected days of the week.

But the story of the Mainwarings goes back much further and many believe this influential Cheshire family had its roots in Cheshire from as early as the Norman conquest. The family themselves claimed that they were descended from Sir Ralph de Mesnilwarin born in 1155 AD who was to become the Justice of Chester in later life.

Next to Peover Hall stands the ancient church of St Lawrence believed to have been first built in the reign of King Edward III between 1327 to 1377. This beautiful church only a stones' throw away from Peover Hall became the burial place of the Mainwarings from as early as 1410 AD. Inside this building stand the alabaster and marble tombs from many generations of the Mainwaring family and they are believed to be some of the finest examples in Cheshire revered by historians since at least the 18th century.


Historical records show that in 1456 Sir Randle Mainwaring died and was buried in the churchyard, however his wife Margery decided that she wanted something so much

more special to remember him by and she duly commissioned a chapel to be built over his grave on the south side of the church. This was completed and today if you visit St Lawrence's church you will see a resplendent canopied tomb inside the church complete with carved stone effigies of Randle and Margery lay side by side.

But the jewel in the crown of this wonderful ancient building has to be the north chapel housing the marble tomb-chest of Sir Philip Mainwaring and his wife Ellen for it is here where we find not only the beautifully carved effigies of the couple but also weapons and armour believed to have belonged to Sir Philip having been worn by him during his life. Today these are to be found mounted on the walls of his chapel. Also suspended above the tomb-chest are relics from the English civil war including helmets and armour.

But St Lawrence's will always be proud that the late General George Patton of the American Third Army and his staff worshipped at the church in 1944 during the time that they occupied Peover Hall. Today you can see the American flag presented by General Patton to the church mounted on the wall alongside a bronze plaque and two photographs of the General. Over Peover has certainly played its part in British history from the 14th century right through to today.

Are You Missing Out on Pension Tax Relief?

Many taxpayers assume that when they pay into a pension, the tax system automatically gives them all the relief they are entitled to. Unfortunately, that is not always the case. Every year, higher and additional rate taxpayers overpay tax simply because they never claim the extra pension relief available to them.

For most employees, pension contributions are paid from income that has already been taxed. The pension provider then adds basic rate tax relief at 20% automatically. While this works perfectly for basic rate taxpayers, it only gives part of the benefit to anyone paying tax at 40% or 45%. The remaining relief does not appear unless the taxpayer actively claims it. If no claim is made, HMRC keeps the difference.

The confusion mainly comes from the different ways pension schemes apply tax relief. Many personal pensions and workplace schemes operate under what is called a relief at source method. Under this arrangement, the individual pays a net contribution and the provider claims 20% from HMRC to top it up. However, that is where the process stops. Higher rate relief is

not automatically added, even though the taxpayer is entitled to it.

By contrast, some schemes operate through payroll using a net pay arrangement or salary sacrifice. In these cases contributions are deducted before tax is calculated, meaning full relief is given automatically. The difficulty is that people rarely know which system their pension uses, and many assume all schemes work the same way.

The financial difference can be substantial. A higher rate taxpayer contributing £10,000 into a relief at source pension would personally pay £8,000 and the provider would add £2,000 basic rate relief. However, a further £2,000 of higher rate relief is still due. If it is not claimed, that money simply remains with HMRC instead of being refunded or reducing the tax bill. Over several years, especially for business owners or senior employees making regular contributions, this can amount to many thousands of pounds.

Different routes to relief

Another common misunderstanding is that a full tax return must be completed to recover the relief. In reality there are two routes available.

Individuals who already complete a return can include the pension contributions within it and HMRC will adjust the calculation accordingly. Those who do not normally file a return can instead submit a standalone claim through HMRC's online service, which is often quicker and avoids additional administrative obligations.

To make a claim, HMRC requires basic supporting information such as the taxpayer's National Insurance number, the pension provider details and the total contributions made in each tax year. Evidence is also needed in the form of a pension statement, letter from the provider or payslip showing the contribution and confirmation that basic rate relief has been applied. Once processed, HMRC usually either repays the tax or adjusts the tax code so less tax is paid in the future.

This issue is becoming increasingly important as pension taxation grows more complex and responsibility shifts towards individuals ensuring the correct relief is received. Future changes are expected to limit how much relief is automatically applied within certain contribution arrangements, meaning

more taxpayers will need to actively reclaim the difference rather than relying on payroll adjustments.

For anyone earning above the basic rate threshold and contributing to a pension that is not salary sacrifice, a quick review is worthwhile. It is also possible to claim relief for previous tax years, meaning refunds are often available even if the oversight has been ongoing for some time.

Pensions remain one of the most tax efficient savings vehicles available, but only when the relief is fully obtained. In many cases the system provides 20% automatically and leaves the rest unclaimed unless action is taken. A simple check can therefore produce a valuable repayment while improving long term retirement savings at the same time.

In short, do not assume the tax system has already done the work for you. Making sure the relief has been claimed properly can make a meaningful difference to both current tax bills and future retirement income.
