

Editor's Comment

IT IS CLEAR THE COUNCIL CUT BACKS WHICH HAVE BEEN TAKING PLACE OVER THE PAST FEW YEARS ARE STARTING TO HAVE AN IMPACT ACROSS THE TOWN.

Elsewhere in this issue we report on the "great North v South grass cutting divide" where people in Lymm and other areas south of the ship canal, believe they are being discriminated against by the borough council.

With the cut backs starting to impact in local parks in the south at the same time as the council announces the intention to close down the Sandy Lane recycling centre at Stockton Heath, it is easy to see why such fears exist.

Neglected

I am aware there are areas in the north of the town which are also being neglected as part of cost cutting measures - but there are others which are being well maintained.

One of these is St Elphinstone Park, but this is not down to the borough council - but a group called "The Friends of St Elphinstone Park" which includes local councillor Tony Higgins.

May be in these days of austerity more projects like this are needed, with community groups helping maintain their green spaces.

Surely it can't do any harm, local

people taking pride in their local community.

I know the council has previously done a "Love where you live" campaign - perhaps more should be done to promote this.

But it does seem strange that at a time the council is promoting huge investment on Omega at Burtonwood and the redevelopment of the town centre on Bridge Street, that as a town, we can't afford to cut the grass or empty park bins.

If we are a boom town, let's make sure we have the right image

to go with the title rather than become a tumbleweed town!

Finally I would like to congratulate Warrington Wolves on reaching another Challenge Cup semi-final and securing the services of Head of Coaching and Rugby Tony Smith on an extended contract until the end of 2016.

Smith has helped revolutionise the club's fortunes and there is no better tonic for the town than a trip to Wembley! Come on the Wire!

Campaign to move war memorial

A CAMPAIGN to move Warrington's war memorial at the Cenotaph on Bridgefoot to a more accessible location is gaining momentum, with a young former soldier who nearly lost his life in Afghanistan, adding his voice to the campaign.

Tom Coleridge, aged 22, who almost died after being shot through the stomach and spine when his patrol was ambushed in July 2010, has teamed up with campaigners who are calling on Warrington Borough Council to re-locate the memorial to all those who have lost their lives in the two world wars and other conflicts.

Wheelchair user Tom, who was injured serving with the 1st Duke of Lancaster's Regiment, has great difficulty accessing the memorial and believes it should be situated in a more accessible location.

He now works for Warrington Disability Partnership who are also backing the campaign which was started by Julie Francis and Jeff Butler.

Campaigner Julie's son Luke joined the army when he was 17 nearly six years ago and serves with the Royal Electrical Mechanical Engineers, while his grandad is also a 78-year-old veteran.

"They would like to have a picture taken together on the Cenotaph but it is so difficult to access they would



have to play chicken to get across the roads."

She said it was also totally unsuitable for wheelchair users like Tom to access it.

Julie added: "The Cenotaph is in a poor state of repair and the names on the walls are not kept up to date as they should be. The roads around the Cenotaph are a death trap - an accident waiting to happen. There is no parking, no seating, no proper access - it is a disgrace."

She said various other locations had been suggested, including the front of the town hall or Victoria Park.

A Council spokesperson said: "We have asked veterans groups to come forward with their views about this with a view to further discussions and so we await their response then we can look at the next steps."





Susan said: "It is an amazing achievement and behalf of all the White family past and present I would like to say a huge thank you to all customers and staff that have been loyal and good friends over the years. Winning the Guinness World Record is the perfect bookend to 113 years of trading in our beloved town centre. Please do pop in and say hello and goodbye before we go!"

After some 40 years Susan is now retiring and is delighted to welcome her son Adam White (41) to now help keep the heritage of Whites Sports Shop alive and online with the www.whitessports.com. 

Veterans return to Burtonwood

FORTY British and American World War 2 veterans attended a reunion at Warrington – and got a chance to see the efforts being made to ensure the town's wartime heritage is not lost as new development is carried out.

It was the first reunion since re-development of the former Burtonwood air base started and Omega Warrington Ltd (OWL) was keen to show how the development will respect the area's heritage.

The 575-acre former base is now the Omega development site – but the first road to be opened was named "Lockheed Road" after the major US aircraft manufacturer.

Burtonwood was Europe's largest military airfield and around 18,000 Americans were stationed there.

Welcoming the veterans, Cllr Terry O'Neill, leader of Warrington Borough Council, said the base had served as a key logistics base for the British and US military for more than 50 years.

It played a pivotal role during

World War 2 and during the Berlin Airlift.

"In its new life as Omega it makes an interesting comparison to see part of the site once again returning to its logistics roots albeit during, thankfully, more peaceful times."

During the 1940s and 1950s there were 7,500 marriages between locals and US citizens stationed at the base, highlighting the importance of the site's history to the local area.

OWL believes it is important to respect and remember the site's unique heritage.

Planning approval for Zone 7 of the Omega development will ensure new heritage-related features will come into place.

Chris Gardner, development manager at Miller Developments – part of the OWL team - said: "The site is so rich with heritage and meeting the veterans has reminded us that there once stood a bustling community on this land. It seems only fitting we pay tribute to the veterans and those who served here and we will continue to look for opportunities to

incorporate references to the site's heritage through names, landscape design and public art. We look forward to working with the RAF Burtonwood Association further."

The day included a tour of the Omega site in the morning. Veterans were accompanied by a local historian and a development consultant to provide an insight on the past and future of the site's development.

This was followed by a quintessential British afternoon tea and 1940s themed entertainment.

Jim Bentley, president of the US Air Force Burtonwood Association, said: "The number of veterans has significantly diminished in recent years; we therefore welcome

Omega's incorporation of the site's heritage in the future and its interest in the RAF Burtonwood Heritage centre. It is through these actions that the memories of the past can stay alive."

Roy Thorpe, president of the RAF Burtonwood Association, said: "The number of veterans who were still able to attend, particularly those who travelled from the US is fantastic! They all have strong memories of the site and the tributes made to the site's heritage encourages a great relationship between developers and ourselves; we look forward to many more visits."

Swimming with sharks

TWO Warrington divers, Peter Coulthard and Peter Holbrook, together with Glyn Hawes from Runcorn, have returned from a diving expedition, which involved studying sharks and other large marine life in the Southern Egyptian Red Sea.

The divers, who all did their qualification dive training with Warrington Sub Aqua Club, flew to Marsa Alam, and then transferred to Port Ghalib to join the diving vessel, Hurricane, which was their home for the next seven nights.

A long overnight sail took them to Daedalus reef, or Abu Kizan, as it is known locally, some 52 miles from Marsa Alam and about half way to Saudi Arabia.

The reef is almost completely submerged, measures only 450 x 100 metres, and is marked by a lighthouse. Currents can be very strong and the reef walls drop initially 30-40 metres and then plummet to depths of over 500 metres.

However, this combination of remoteness, depth and currents

attracts an extremely varied fish life including hammerhead sharks and manta rays.

The divers had to wait for some time and air supplies were dwindling when a large hammerhead shark appeared.

Peter Holbrook said: "It came swimming along the reef wall at the same level as ourselves, straight towards us. It kept coming, seeming to grow larger and larger, until it turned aside when only a couple of metres away and was gone as quickly as it had arrived."

Back aboard the Hurricane, the divers agreed that it appeared Hammerhead sharks were generally found in large schools, with "sentries" cruising in advance to spot potential threats.

It was likely that the single shark encountered had been "checking out" the divers.

A further five dives were carried out and on each occasion large schools were encountered at short range. And more than 20 large sharks were seen at once.

There were also many sightings of Manta Rays.

The vessel sailed on further south to Rocky Island and Zabaragd were more Hammerhead and grey reef sharks were encountered, as well as dolphins.

The divers also investigated the site of a mysterious ship wreck.

Originally thought to be a cargo ship, the suspicion is that it was a surveillance vessel, and the mystery intensified when it is noted that the hull appeared to have been damaged by an internal explosion and not by contact with the reef.

It was clear from all of the evidence that this vessel was used as an "intelligence gatherer", but what was she doing tucked away in a bay in a quiet corner of Egypt near the Sudanese border?

The final leg of the expedition was back north, to Elphinstone, a long, finger shaped reef, extending 300 metres long and one of the most beautiful dive sites in the south of Egypt.


Mr Holbrook said the walls of the reef were spectacular, plunging to more than 100 metres.

"Usually it is an excellent location for sightings of Oceanic whitetip sharks. However, whereas on normal days, the current will be raging, on this visit there was no current whatsoever. This unfortunately meant that the sharks were elsewhere, but it presented the opportunity of two dives to the very ends of both the north and south plateaus, to 50 metres and 37 metres respectively, which is very rarely possible."

Warrington's great north v south grass cutting divide!

RESIDENTS living in south Warrington fear a great north v south divide is being created by Warrington Borough Council when it comes to grass cutting and emptying litter bins in local parks and play areas.

People living in Lymm have been complaining about the complete neglect of public spaces by WBC - Ridgway Grundy Park particularly, but also all grass areas.

Local resident Kieran Walshe said: "They seem to have completely ceased grass cutting and bin emptying.

"The park has rubbish strewn everywhere because bins are not being emptied, a lot of it is unusable because the grass and weeds including nettles are a foot to two feet high, and there is a real health problem with dog mess - dog owners can't clear up after their dogs in long grass.

A neighbour of mine was so exercised about this that he went around taking pictures of various parks in Warrington.

"They clearly illustrate what looks like the old problem of WBC ignoring/neglecting Lymm.

Mr Walshe added: "The grass has not been cut for months, and is so long and full of nettles and weeds that most of the park is unusable by children, dog walkers and so on.

"The bins are rarely emptied and are always overflowing with rubbish strewn around the play area. It's a disgrace.

"They say it's because of budget

cuts, but Victoria Park in Warrington is still being maintained, and they can still afford to cut the lawns outside the Town Hall."

Local Cllr Sheila Woodyatt added: "I am working very hard, as I have done for the last 35 years to try and get a good deal for Lymm - but I cannot perform miracles!

"There have been cutbacks and we now only have four men working in Lymm instead of eight. Ridgway Grundy park is a jewel in the crown of Lymm and I will do all I can to try and ensure it is looked after as it deserves.

"Funnily enough people think the Council spends more in Warrington South than the North. It was ever thus. When I was Mayor it didn't matter where I went they always believed that everywhere else did better than they did."

Former leader of the council and fellow Lymm councillor Ian Marks added: "We know that all councils are having to make savings but this is no excuse for the neglect we are starting to see in our open spaces.

"I am quite sure there is plenty of scope for the Council to work in a more joined up way and more creatively so that more can be done with the resources available. Closer collaboration with the Parish Council, local volunteers and Friends' Groups is a fruitful way forward too."

"What disturbs me is that there is some evidence that open spaces across the town are not being treated equally. Looking at some of the parks in the inner areas it

appears they are not suffering in the same way that open spaces in the outer areas are.

"It would be quite unacceptable if the Labour Administration was favouring the wards they represent.

"It seems rather strange that at a time when so much investment is being put into parks in the town to improve them, the Administration is cutting back on their maintenance. It doesn't make sense."

A Council spokesperson said: "The council has faced severe reductions in the funding available to pay for our local services. Officers and Councillors have been forced to make savings and have tried to make these in areas which will have the least impact on residents.

"Grass cutting schedules have

been modified and some grassland areas will be cut less often than they were in the past to make savings. The grass will be cut less often in locations where short mown grass is not a necessity for recreational use such as highway verges, low use areas within parks and open spaces and rural verges. There will be no change in the way football pitches, bowling greens, play areas and high use amenity areas are managed.

"We have invested in new flail mowers which are more suited to cutting longer grass and mulch the cuttings back into the grass. This will mean that when the grass grows long the new machinery will cut it without difficulty allowing us to reduce the frequency of cuts and save money."



He successfully got back on the borough council representing Grappenhall and Thelwall, where he has been a parish councillor for 31 years, in 2012 and now having served a second term as deputy mayor, has at last become Mayor of Warrington – with his wife Mavis, his Mayoress.

Warrington born and bred Cllr Finnegan started work as an office boy at the age of 15, later becoming a metal worker and engineering buyer for four international companies.

He was proposed as the town's 131st Mayor by Lib Dem leader Cllr Ian Marks who described him as "very much a man of the people."

Fellow Lib Dem councillor and

former Mayor Cllr Mike Biggin seconded the proposal, saying Cllr Finnegan, was the 5th Mayor from the parish of Grappenhall and Thelwall, the first being Joseph Parr in 1901.

"When he gets hold of an issue he will not let go and will take it right to the top to get it resolved," added Cllr Biggin.

Cllr Finnegan was unanimously elected Mayor for 2014/15, with Labour councillor Geoff Settle elected as his deputy.



Employment Team support residents into work

GOLDEN Gates Housing Trust's (GGHT) Employment Team, successfully supported 31 of its residents into work during May – one job for every day of the month!

The 31 jobs are with a wide range of employers from across Warrington and the surrounding area, including HM Prison Service (Risley), Arriva Runcorn, American Golf, Travis Perkins, Sofaworks, Maplin, Tesco and Toby Carvery.

Additionally, three of the jobs residents successfully gained in May were with Cheshire Fencing, Livewire & Total Glass. These companies all recruited local people through GGHT and Warrington Borough Council's Employer Wage Incentive programme.

The job roles have been promoted by GGHT's Employment Initiatives Team through its weekly job clubs across the town and on social media. Since 2012 the team has helped over 260 of its tenants and their family members into employment, as well as providing additional access to training and volunteering opportunities. They remain on target to support up to 450 local residents into employment by the end of 2015.

The Wage Incentive Scheme was launched by GGHT and WBC in 2013 and offers local voluntary sector organisations and

small/medium sized employers an incentivised package of between £3,000 and £5,000 to provide apprenticeships and jobs with training. GGHT's Employment Team are also able to offer those taking part free recruitment services and in work support to ensure companies gain the right employee for their business needs.

GGHT offers a range of free training opportunities for its tenants and their family members. Many residents have also applied to and have been successful in gaining funds from the GGHT Employability Fund, enabling them to buy new clothes for interviews, a bicycle to get to work and printing of leaflets to promote their new self

employment services.

GGHT Employment Engagement Officer, Clare Sing said: "I am excited about being able to offer this incentive to local employers. To date it has enabled small businesses to recruit and increase their workforce and productivity and provide valuable job opportunities to Warrington residents."

GGHT resident and Positive Change member, Margaret Hitchman said: "I would advise anyone who is out of work, lacking in confidence and feeling down, to get in touch with The Positive Change team, they will help and support you in all of the processes of helping to find work."

National minimum wage

It is 15 years since the National Minimum Wage was first introduced in 1999. It currently stands at £6.31 per hour for adult workers and this is set to increase in October to £6.50. This means that someone working 35 hours per week should be earning £221 per week, or £957 per month, before deductions. It is the responsibility of HM Revenue & Customs (HMRC) to enforce the legislation, and they have just published the latest results of their investigations.

Over the past 12 months, HMRC have investigated 1,455 cases and found underpayments in 47% of these cases. This seems a high figure, even though many of the investigations would have been the result of a complaint lodged by an employee. Total reimbursements to employees amounted to over £4.5m, and penalties of over £800,000 have been issued.

In one case a Premier League football club was ordered to pay arrears of £27,500 to over 3,000

workers. Frances O'Grady at the TUC said "It is shocking that so many employers, including some who pay their star players millions of pounds a year, are cheating low paid workers out of the minimum wage".

Since last October new rules enabled HMRC to name and shame offenders, and the latest list of 25 employers, all small businesses, has been released. Between them they underpaid a total of £43,000 with the largest being a firm in the Wirral underpaying £7,310 to 3 workers. However, for reasons known only to themselves, HMRC have decided not to name the football club. This seems to be another example of HMRC dealing with some taxpayers more leniently than others.

In many cases the underpayments seem to be the result of misunderstandings of what should be included in the calculations. Many, for instance, resulted from the employer not paying for travelling time. One case that we recall from the early days was a result of the personal allowance being increased. The employer had agreed a net pay level with the employee. When the



personal allowance increased the gross pay fell, and as a result was below the minimum wage level.

The National Minimum Wage is only one set of regulations that employers need to comply with, another being Real Time Information which we have covered previously. As part of our payroll service we endeavour to ensure that clients do not fall foul of any of these regulations.
